## A BILL

To expand the applicability of daylight saving time.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Halloween Safety Act5 of 2004".

6 SEC. 2. DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME EXTENDED TO FIRST
7 WEEK IN NOVEMBER.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3(a) of the Uniform Time
9 Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. 260a(a)) is amended by striking
10 "last Sunday of October" and inserting "first Sunday of
11 November".

(b) EFFECT ON EXISTING STATE ELECTIONS.—Any
 law in effect on the date of the enactment of this Act
 which is—

4 (1) adopted pursuant to section 3(a)(2) of the
5 Uniform Time Act of 1966 by a State with parts
6 thereof in more than one time zone; or

7 (2) adopted pursuant to section 3(a)(1) of such
8 Act by a State that lies entirely within one time
9 zone,

10 shall be held and considered to remain in effect as the11 exercise by that State of the exemption permitted by such12 Act unless that State, by law, provides that such exemp-13 tion shall not apply.

14 (c) ADJUSTMENT OF OPERATING HOURS OF DAY-15 TIME BROADCASTERS.—(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any regulation issued under law, the 16 17 Federal Communications Commission shall, consistent with any existing treaty or other agreement, make such 18 19 adjustment by general rules, or by interim action pending 20 such general rules, with respect to hours of operation of 21 daytime standard amplitude modulation broadcast sta-22 tions as may be consistent with the public interest in re-23 ceiving interference-free service.

24 (2) The general rules, or interim action, undertaken25 under paragraph (1) may include variances with respect

to operating power and other technical operating charac teristics.

3 (3) At any time after the adoption of general rules
4 under paragraph (1), the general rules may be varied with
5 respect to particular stations and areas because of the ex6 igencies in each case.
