To prohibit the award of a Federal contract unless the contractor agrees to offer their employees certain health insurance benefits.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON GIVING ADVANTAGE IN PUB-
4	LIC-PRIVATE COMPETITION TO ENTITIES
5	PROVIDING LESS HEALTH INSURANCE BENE-
6	FITS THAN BENEFITS PROVIDED TO FED-
7	ERAL EMPLOYEES
8	In the case of any public-private competition held
9	under Office of Management and Budget Circular A–76
10	or any other outsourcing policy for the conversion of an

- 1 activity or function performed by Federal employees, no
- 2 advantage shall be given to an offeror for a proposal to
- 3 save costs for the Federal Government by either—
- 4 (1) failing to offer employer-sponsored health 5 insurance benefits to workers to be employed under 6 the contract for the performance of such activity or 7 function; or
 - (2) offering employer-sponsored health insurance benefits to such workers that are less than the benefits provided for Federal employees under chapter 89 of title 5, United States Code.
