## A BILL

- To amend the Public Health Service Act to authorize grants to hospitals for measurement-based strategies to improve the quality and efficiency of health care.

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Improving Efficiency

5 and Quality in Hospitals Act of 2004".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 7 The Congress finds as follows:
- 8 (1) The goals of the Institute of Medicine, as
  9 expressed in its report entitled "Crossing the Quality

1 Chasm: A New Health System for the 21st Cen-2 tury", are to increase quality and efficiency in hos-3 pitals and health care systems. 4 (2) Approaches such as Six Sigma, Root Cause 5 Analysis, and Failure Mode and Effect Analysis 6 have succeeded in reducing errors, cutting costs, and 7 improving services. 8 SEC. 3. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FOR IMPROVING QUAL-9 ITY AND EFFICIENCY AT HOSPITALS. 10 Part A of title IX of the Public Health Service Act 11 (42 U.S.C. 299 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following: 12 13 "SEC. 904. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FOR IMPROVING 14 **QUALITY AND EFFICIENCY AT HOSPITALS.** 15 "(a) GRANTS.—The Secretary, acting through the Director, may make grants to hospitals for developing and 16 implementing measurement-based strategies to improve 17 18 the quality and efficiency of health care. 19 "(b) USE OF FUNDS.—The Secretary may not make a grant to a hospital under this section unless the hospital 20 21 agrees to use the grant, with respect to health care at the 22 hospital, to improve the following: 23 "(1) Safety.

24 "(2) Injury avoidance.

"(3) Effectiveness of services, based on sci entific knowledge and focusing on patients.
 "(4) Timeliness.
 "(5) Efficiency.
 "(6) Equitable distribution of services.
 "(c) DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary shall make
 grants under this section to urban hospitals, non-urban

8 hospitals, teaching hospitals, and hospitals with fewer9 than 50 acute care beds.

"(d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
of the enactment of this section, the Secretary shall conduct an assessment of the results of grants under this section and submit to the Congress a report on the findings
and conclusions of the assessment.

15 "(e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
16 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
17 such sums as may be necessary for the period of fiscal
18 years 2005 through 2007.".

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
