Mr. CRAMER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To establish the President's Council of Advisors on Manufacturing.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Manufacturing Advi-
- 5 sory Council Establishment Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Manufacturing is a critical component of
- 9 the economy of the United States.

| 1 | (2) A strong manufacturing sector is important |

| 4 | (3) United States manufacturers can compete |
| 5 | globally as long as they are not subjected to anti- |
| 6 | competitive trade practices. |
| 7 | (4) The United States manufacturing industry |
| 8 | is presently facing many challenges, both domestic |
| 9 | and international. |
| 10 | (5) The President would benefit from regular, |
| 11 | informed advice from a variety of sources within the |
| 12 | Unites States manufacturing sector, including rep- |
| 13 | resentatives of small and mid-sized businesses, on |
| 14 | policies that affect manufacturing. |
| 15 | SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT. |
| 16 | There is established a council to be known as the |
| 17 | "President's Council of Advisors on Manufacturing". |
| 18 | SEC. 4. DUTIES. |
| 19 | The duties of the Council shall be— |
| 20 | (1) to advise the President on policy matters af- |
| 21 | fecting the domestic manufacturing sector; |
| 22 | (2) to assist in the development of policies that |
| 23 | will— |
| 24 | (A) reduce production costs within the |
| 25 | manufacturing sector, |

| 1 | (B) promote the competitiveness of prod- |

| 2 | ucts manufactured in the United States in |
| 3 | international markets, |
| 4 | (C) encourage innovation, investment, and |
| 5 | productivity in the manufacturing sector, and |
| 6 | (D) ensure an adequate supply of skilled |
| 7 | workers in the manufacturing sector; and |
| 8 | (3) to assist the Secretary of Commerce in se- |
| 9 | curing private sector involvement for Department of |
| 10 | Commerce activities. |
| 11 | SEC. 5. MEMBERSHIP. |
| 12 | (a) Number and Appointment.—The Council shall |
| 13 | be composed of 25 members appointed by the President |
| 14 | as follows: |
| 15 | (1) 1 member shall be an officer or employee of |
| 16 | the Federal Government. |
| 17 | (2) 24 members shall be individuals who— |
| 18 | (A) are not officers or employees of the |
| 19 | Federal Government; |
| 20 | (B) have expertise in manufacturing; and |
| 21 | (C) represent businesses of various sizes |
| 22 | and industries within the manufacturing sector. |
| 23 | (b) Continuation of Membership.—If a member |
| 24 | was appointed to the Council as an officer or employee |
| 25 | of the Federal Government and the member ceases to be |

| 1 | an officer or employee of the Federal Government, or was |

| 2 | appointed to the Council because the member was not an |
| 3 | officer or employee of the Federal Government and later |
| 4 | becomes an officer or employee of the Federal Govern- |
| 5 | ment, that member may continue as a member for not |
| 6 | longer than the 90-day period beginning on the date that |
| 7 | the member ceases to be an officer or employee of the Fed- |
| 8 | eral Government, or becomes such an officer or employee, |
| 9 | as the case may be. |
| 10 | (c) Terms.— |
| 11 | (1) IN GENERAL.—Each member shall be ap- |
| 12 | pointed for a term of 2 years, except as provided in |
| 13 | paragraphs (2) and (3). |
| 14 | (2) Terms of initial appointees.—As des- |
| 15 | ignated by the President at the time of appointment, |
| 16 | of the members first appointed— |
| 17 | (A) 8 shall be appointed for terms of 4 |
| 18 | years; |
| 19 | (B) 8 shall be appointed for terms of 3 |
| 20 | years; |
| 21 | (C) 8 shall be appointed for terms of 2 |
| 22 | years; and |
| 23 | (D) the member appointed under sub- |
| 24 | section (a)(1) shall be appointed for a term of |
| 25 | 2 years. |

- 1 (3) VACANCIES.—Any member appointed to fill 2 a vacancy occurring before the expiration of the 3 term for which the member's predecessor was ap-4 pointed shall be appointed only for the remainder of 5 that term. A member may serve after the expiration 6 of that member's term until a successor has taken 7 office.
- 8 (d) DEADLINE FOR APPOINTMENT.—The appoint-9 ments of the members of the Council shall be made no 10 later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this 11 Act.
- 12 (e) CO-CHAIRS.—The co-chairs of the Council shall 13 be the member appointed under subsection (a)(1) and one 14 member appointed under subsection (a)(2) who is des-15 ignated by the President at the time of appointment.

(f) Meetings.—

- 17 (1) FIRST MEETING.—The Council shall hold
 18 its first meeting on a date designated by the co19 chairs which is not later than 30 days after the date
 20 on which all members have been appointed.
- 21 (2) Subsequent meetings.—After the first 22 meeting, the Council shall meet at least semi-annu-23 ally upon the call of the co-chairs.
- 24 (g) NO COMPENSATION FOR SERVICE.—The mem-25 bers shall serve on the Council without compensation.

- 1 (h) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Each member shall receive
- 2 travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence,
- 3 in accordance with applicable provisions under subchapter
- 4 I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code.

5 SEC. 6. POWERS OF THE COUNCIL.

- 6 (a) Information and Advice.—As the Council
- 7 finds appropriate, the Council may seek information and
- 8 advice from persons who are not members of the Council.
- 9 (b) Obtaining Official Data.—The Council may
- 10 secure directly from any agency of the United States infor-
- 11 mation necessary to enable it to carry out this Act. Upon
- 12 the request of either co-chair, the head of that department
- 13 or agency shall furnish that information to the Council.
- 14 (c) Mails.—The Council may use the United States
- 15 mails in the same manner and under the same conditions
- 16 as other departments and agencies of the United States.

17 SEC. 7. ADMINISTRATION.

- 18 (a) Expenses.—Any expenses incurred by the Coun-
- 19 cil shall be paid from the funds available to the Assistant
- 20 Secretary of Commerce responsible for manufacturing and
- 21 services, as determined by the Secretary of Commerce.
- 22 (b) Administrative Services.—The Assistant Sec-
- 23 retary of Commerce responsible for manufacturing and
- 24 services, as determined by the Secretary of Commerce,

- 1 shall provide any administrative support services required
- 2 by the Council.
- 3 SEC. 8. NO TERMINATION.
- 4 Section 14(a)(2)(B) of the Federal Advisory Com-
- 5 mittee Act (5 U.S.C. App.; relating to the termination of
- 6 advisory committees) shall not apply to the Council.
