A BILL

To establish a servitude and emancipation archival research clearinghouse in the National Archives.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Servitude and Emanci-
- 5 pation Archival Research ClearingHouse Act of 2004" or
- 6 the "SEARCH Act of 2004".

1 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF DATABASE.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Archivist of the United
- 3 States shall establish, as a part of the National Archives,
- 4 a national database consisting of historic records of ser-
- 5 vitude and emancipation in the United States to assist Af-
- 6 rican Americans in researching their genealogy.
- 7 (b) Maintenance.—The database established by
- 8 this Act shall be maintained by the National Historical
- 9 Publications and Records Commission.

10 SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 11 There are authorized to be appropriated—
- 12 (1) \$5,000,000 to establish the national data-
- base authorized by this Act; and
- 14 (2) \$5,000,000 to provide grants to States and
- 15 colleges and universities to preserve local records of
- servitude and emancipation.
