## AN ACT

To provide for the conveyance to the Government of Mexico of a decommissioned National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ship, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 1 SECTION 1. CONVEYANCE OF NOAA VESSEL WHITING.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Commerce shall
- 3 convey to the Government of Mexico, without consider-
- 4 ation, all right, title, and interest of the United States in
- 5 and to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administra-
- 6 tion vessel WHITING—
- 7 (1) for use as a hydrographic survey platform
- 8 in support of activities of the United States-Mexico
- 9 Charting Advisors Committee; and
- 10 (2) to enhance coordination and cooperation be-
- tween the United States and Mexico regarding hy-
- drographic surveying and nautical charting activities
- in the border waters of both countries in the Gulf
- of Mexico and in the Pacific Ocean.
- 15 (b) OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.—The Govern-
- 16 ment of the United States shall not be responsible or liable
- 17 for any remediation, maintenance, or operation of a vessel
- 18 conveyed under this section after the date of the delivery
- 19 of the vessel to the Government of Mexico.
- 20 (c) Deadline.—The Secretary shall seek to complete
- 21 the conveyance by as soon as practicable after the date
- 22 of the enactment of this Act.
- 23 (d) Delivery of Vessel.—The Secretary shall de-
- 24 liver the vessel WHITING pursuant to this section at the

- 1 vessel's homeport location of Norfolk, Virginia, at no addi-
- 2 tional cost to the United States.
