# **AN ACT**

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to recruit volunteers to assist with, or facilitate, the activities of various agencies and offices of the Department of the Interior.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Department of the In3 terior Volunteer Recruitment Act of 2004".

#### 4 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Secretary
of the Interior to recruit and use volunteers to assist with,
or facilitate, the programs of the Bureau of Indian Affairs,
the United States Geological Survey, the Bureau of Reclamation, and the Office of the Secretary.

### 10 SEC. 3. VOLUNTEER AUTHORITY.

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior may 12 recruit, train, and accept, without regard to the civil service classification laws, rules, or regulations, the services 13 of individuals, contributed without compensation as volun-14 teers, for aiding in or facilitating the activities adminis-15 tered by the Secretary through the Bureau of Indian Af-16 fairs, the United States Geological Survey, the Bureau of 17 Reclamation, and the Office of the Secretary. 18

19 (b) RESTRICTIONS ON ACTIVITIES OF VOLUN-20 TEERS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—In accepting such services of
individuals as volunteers, the Secretary shall not
permit the use of volunteers in law enforcement
work, in regulatory and enforcement work, in policymaking processes, or to displace any employee.

(2) PRIVATE PROPERTY.—No volunteer services
 authorized by this Act may be conducted on private
 property unless the officer or employee charged with
 supervising the volunteer obtains appropriate con sent to enter the property from the property owner.

6 (3) HAZARDOUS DUTY.—The Secretary may ac-7 cept the services of individuals in hazardous duty 8 only upon a determination by the Secretary that 9 such individuals are skilled in performing hazardous 10 duty activities.

(4) SUPERVISION.—The Secretary shall ensure
that an appropriate officer or employee of the
United States provides adequate and appropriate supervision of each volunteer whose services the Secretary accepts.

16 (c) PROVISION OF SERVICES AND COSTS.—The Sec-17 retary may provide for services and costs incidental to the 18 utilization of volunteers, including transportation, sup-19 plies, uniforms, lodging, subsistence (without regard to 20 place of residence), recruiting, training, supervision, and 21 awards and recognition (including nominal cash awards).

22 (d) FEDERAL EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF VOLUN-23 TEERS.—

24 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this sub-25 section, a volunteer shall not be deemed a Federal

	employee and shall not be subject to the provisions
2	of law relating to Federal employment, including
3	those provisions relating to hours of work, rates of
4	compensation, leave, unemployment compensation,
5	and Federal employee benefits.
6	(2) Volunteers shall be deemed employees of the
7	United States for the purposes of—
8	(A) the tort claims provisions of title 28,
9	United States Code;
10	(B) subchapter I of chapter 81 of title 5,
11	United States Code; and
12	(C) claims relating to damage to, or loss
13	of, personal property of a volunteer incident to
14	volunteer service, in which case the provisions
15	of section 3721 of title 31, United States Code,
16	shall apply.
17	(3) Volunteers under this Act shall be subject
18	to chapter 11 of title 18, United States Code, unless
19	the Secretary, with the concurrence of the Director
	of the Office of Government Ethics, determines in
20	
20 21	writing published in the Federal Register that the

- 1 unteers who carry out only those duties or functions
- 2 specified in the determination.
