Mr. COOPER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the

A BILL

Making further emergency supplemental appropriations for
fiscal year 2004 for military operations in Iraq and Af-
ghanistan.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for fis-
5 cal year 2004:

1 TITLE I—NATIONAL SECURITY

2 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE—MILITARY

3 MILITARY PERSONNEL

4 MILITARY PERSONNEL, ARMY

5 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
6 Army”, \$11,571,925,563.

7 MILITARY PERSONNEL, NAVY

8 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
9 Navy”, \$500,000,000.

10 MILITARY PERSONNEL, MARINE CORPS

11 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
12 Marine Corps”, \$714,572,724.

13 MILITARY PERSONNEL, AIR FORCE

14 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
15 Air Force”, \$1,000,000,000.

16 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

17 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, ARMY

18 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-

4 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, AIR FORCE

5 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-

7 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, DEFENSE-WIDE

8 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-
9 tenance, Defense-Wide”, \$3,370,959,606, of which—

10 (1) not to exceed \$11,609,448 may be used for
11 the CINC Initiative Fund account, to be used pri-
12 marily in Iraq and Afghanistan;

13 (2) \$24,766,822 is only for the Family Advo-
14 cacy Program; and

15 (3) not to exceed \$890,057,690, to remain
16 available until expended, may be used, notwith-
17 standing any other provision of law, for payments to
18 reimburse Pakistan, Jordan, and other key cooper-
19 ating nations, for logistical and military support pro-
20 vided, or to be provided, to United States military
21 operations in connection with military action in Iraq
22 and the global war on terrorism: *Provided*, That
23 such payments may be made in such amounts as the
24 Secretary of Defense, with the concurrence of the
25 Secretary of State, and in consultation with the Di-

1 rector of the Office of Management and Budget,
 2 may determine, in his discretion, based on docu-
 3 mentation determined by the Secretary of Defense to
 4 adequately account for the support provided, and
 5 such determination is final and conclusive upon the
 6 accounting officers of the United States, and 15
 7 days following notification to the appropriate con-
 8 gressional committees: *Provided further*, That the
 9 Secretary of Defense shall provide quarterly reports
 10 to the Committees on Appropriations on the use of
 11 these funds.

18 30, 2006.

19 PROCUREMENT, MARINE CORPS

20 For an additional amount for “Procurement, Marine
21 Corps”, \$153,104,628, to remain available until Sep-
22 tember 30, 2006.

1 OTHER PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

2 For an additional amount for “Other Procurement,
3 Air Force”, \$660,890,156, to remain available until Sep-
4 tember 30, 2006.

11 For an additional amount for “Defense Health Pro-
12 gram”, \$509,561,898 for operation and maintenance.

13 DRUG INTERDICTION AND COUNTER-DRUG ACTIVITIES,

14 DEFENSE

15 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

16 For an additional amount for “Drug Interdiction and
17 Counter-Drug Activities, Defense”, \$56,499,314: *Pro-*
18 *vided*, That these funds may be used only for such activi-
19 ties related to Afghanistan: *Provided further*, That the
20 Secretary of Defense may transfer the funds provided
21 herein only to appropriations for military personnel; oper-
22 ation and maintenance; procurement; and research, devel-
23 opment, test and evaluation: *Provided further*, That the
24 funds transferred shall be merged with and be available
25 for the same purposes and for the same time period, as

1 the appropriation to which transferred: *Provided further*,
2 That the transfer authority provided in this paragraph is
3 in addition to any other transfer authority available to the
4 Department of Defense.

5 TITLE II—GENERAL PROVISIONS

6 SEC. 201. Except as otherwise expressly provided in
7 this Act, amounts appropriated in this Act shall remain
8 available until September 30, 2005.

9 SEC. 202. The amounts provided in this Act are des-
10 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement
11 pursuant to section 502 of H. Con. Res. 95 (108th Con-
12 gress).

13 This Act may be cited as the “Emergency Supple-
14 mental Appropriations Act for Military Operations in Iraq
15 and Afghanistan, 2004”.

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
