1	SECTION 1. FEDERAL CONTRACTS SUSPENSION FOR UN-
2	PAID FINES RESULTING FROM VIOLATIONS
3	OF OSHA THAT CAUSE DEATH OF AN EM-
4	PLOYEE.
5	(a) Suspension.—Section 17(e) of the Occupational
6	Safety and Health Act of $1970~(29~\mathrm{U.S.C.}~666(e))$ is
7	amended—
8	(1) by striking "(e)" and inserting "(e)(1)";
9	and
10	(2) by adding at the end the following new
11	paragraph:
12	"(2)(A) The Secretary shall suspend a person from
13	procurement activities and nonprocurement activities upon
14	a finding by the Secretary that the person has not paid
15	a fine imposed for a violation of paragraph (1). Such sus-
16	pension shall continue until a finding by the Secretary
17	that the fine is paid.
18	"(B) In this paragraph:
19	"(i) The term 'suspend' means to disqualify,
20	pursuant to established administrative procedures,
21	from Government contracting and subcontracting, or
22	from participation in nonprocurement activities.
