Making appropriations for the Department of Veterans Affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes.

Mr. EDWARDS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

Making appropriations for the Department of Veterans Affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
5 Department of Veterans Affairs for the fiscal year ending
6 September 30, 2005, and for other purposes, namely:

1 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

2 VETERANS HEALTH ADMINISTRATION

3 MEDICAL CARE

4 For necessary expenses for the maintenance and op-
5 eration of hospitals, nursing homes, and domiciliary facili-
6 ties; for furnishing, as authorized by law, inpatient and
7 outpatient care and treatment to beneficiaries of the De-
8 partment of Veterans Affairs and Veterans described in
9 paragraphs (1) through (8) of section 1705(a) of title 38,
10 United States Code, including care and treatment in facili-
11 ties not under the jurisdiction of the Department and in-
12 cluding medical supplies and equipment and salaries and
13 expenses of health care employees hired under title 38,
14 United States Code; and furnishing recreational facilities,
15 supplies, and equipment; funeral, burial, and other ex-
16 penses incidental thereto for beneficiaries receiving care
17 in the Department; administrative expenses in support of
18 planning, design, project management, real property ac-
19 quisition and disposition, construction and renovation of
20 any facility under the jurisdiction or for the use of the
21 Department; oversight, engineering and architectural ac-
22 tivities not charged to project costs; repairing, altering,
23 improving or providing facilities in the several hospitals
24 and homes under the jurisdiction of the department, not
25 otherwise provided for, either by contract or by the hire

1 of temporary employees and purchase of materials; infor-
2 mation technology hardware and software; uniforms or al-
3 lowances therefor, as authorized by 5 U.S.C. 5901–5902;
4 other services authorized by 5 U.S.C. 3109 including hire
5 of passenger motor vehicles; lease of a facility or land or
6 both; aid to State homes as authorized by 38 U.S.C. 1741;
7 administrative and legal expenses of the Department for
8 collecting and recovering amounts owed the Department
9 as authorized under 38 U.S.C. chapter 17, and the Fed-
10 eral Medical Care Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. 2651 et seq.,
11 \$28,994,000,000, plus reimbursements: *Provided*, That no
12 appropriations from this account shall be available for the
13 purchase of any site for or toward the construction of any
14 new hospital or home: *Provided further*, That no appro-
15 priations in this account shall be available for hospitaliza-
16 tion or examination of any persons (except beneficiaries
17 entitled under the laws bestowing such benefits to vet-
18 erans, and persons receiving such treatment under 5
19 U.S.C.7901–7904 or 42 U.S.C. 5141–5204), unless reim-
20 bursement of cost is made to this account at such rates
21 as may be fixed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs: *Pro-*
22 *vided further*, That no appropriations in this account shall
23 be available to enter into any new lease of real property
24 if the estimated annual rental is more than \$300,000 un-
25 less the Secretary submits a report which the Committees

1 on Appropriations of the Congress approve within 30 days
2 following the date on which the report is received: *Pro-*
3 *vided further*, That, notwithstanding any other provision
4 of law, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs may authorize
5 the dispensing of prescription drugs from Veterans Health
6 Administration facilities to enrolled veterans with privately
7 written prescriptions based on requirements established by
8 the Secretary: *Provided further*, That the implementation
9 of the program described in the previous proviso shall
10 incur no additional cost to the Department of Veterans
11 Affairs: *Provided further*, That: (a) the Secretary of Vet-
12 erans Affairs shall conduct by contract a program of re-
13 covery audits for the fee basis and other medical services
14 contracts with respect to payments for hospital care. Not-
15 withstanding section 3302(b) of title 31, United States
16 Code, amounts collected, by setoff or otherwise, as the re-
17 sult of such audits shall be available without fiscal year
18 limitation, for the purposes for which funds are appro-
19 priated under this account and the purposes of paying a
20 contractor a percent of the amount collected as a result
21 of an audit carried out by the contractor: and (b) all
22 amounts so collected under subsection (a) with respect to
23 a designated health care region (as that term is defined
24 in section 1729A(d)(2) of title 38, United States Code)
25 shall be allocated, not of payments to the contractor, to

1 that region: *Provided further*, That amounts deducted
2 from enhanced-use lease proceeds to reimburse an account
3 for expenses incurred by that account during a prior fiscal
4 year for providing enhanced-use lease services, may be ob-
5 ligated during the fiscal year in which the proceeds are
6 received.

7 MEDICAL CARE COLLECTIONS FUND

8 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

9 Amounts deposited during the current fiscal year in
10 the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Care Collec-
11 tions Fund under section 1729A of title 38 U.S.C., may
12 be transferred to “Medical care”, to remain available until
13 expended: *Provided*, That notwithstanding any other pro-
14 visions of law, at the discretion of the Secretary of Vet-
15 erans Affairs, proceeds or revenues derived from en-
16 hanced-use leasing activities (including disposal) that are
17 deposited into this account may be transferred and merged
18 with “Construction, major projects” and “Construction,
19 minor projects” accounts and be used for construction (in-
20 cluding site acquisition and disposition), alterations and
21 improvements of any medical facility under the jurisdic-
22 tion or for the use of the Department of Veterans Affairs.
23 Such sums as realized are in addition to the amount pro-
24 vided for in “Construction, major projects” and “Con-
25 struction, minor projects”.

1 MEDICAL AND PROSTHETIC RESEARCH

2 For necessary expenses in carrying out programs of
3 medical and prosthetic research and development as au-
4 thorized by chapter 73 of title 38, United States Code,
5 to remain available until September 30, 2006,
6 \$415,000,000, plus reimbursements: *Provided*, That no
7 appropriations from this account shall be available for the
8 purchase of any site for or toward the construction of any
9 new hospital or home: *Provided further*, That no appro-
10 priations in this account shall be available for hospitaliza-
11 tion or examination of any persons (except beneficiaries
12 entitled under the laws bestowing such benefits to vet-
13 erans, and persons receiving such treatment under 5
14 U.S.C. 7901–7904 or 42 U.S.C. 5141–5204), unless reim-
15 bursement of cost is made to the “Medical care” account
16 at such rates as may be fixed by the Secretary of Veterans
17 Affairs: *Provided further*, That no appropriations in this
18 account shall be available to enter into any new lease of
19 real property if the estimated annual rental is more than
20 \$300,000 unless the Secretary submits a report which the
21 Committees on Appropriations of the Congress approve
22 within 30 days following the date on which the report is
23 received: *Provided further*, That amounts deducted from
24 enhanced-use lease proceeds to reimburse an account for
25 expenses incurred by that account during a prior fiscal

1 year for providing enhanced-use lease services, may be ob-
2 ligated during the fiscal year in which the proceeds are
3 received.

4 MEDICAL ADMINISTRATION AND MISCELLANEOUS

5 OPERATING EXPENSES

6 For necessary expenses in the administration of the
7 medical, hospital, nursing home, domiciliary, construction,
8 supply and research activities, as authorized by law; for
9 other services authorized by 5 U.S.C. 3109 including hire
10 of passenger motor vehicles; lease of a facility or land or
11 both; and uniforms or allowances therefor, as authorized
12 by 5 U.S.C. 5901–5902; administrative expenses in sup-
13 port of capital policy activities, \$87,000,000, of which
14 \$4,350,000 shall be available until September 30, 2006,
15 plus reimbursements: *Provided*, That technical and con-
16 sulting services offered by the Facilities Management
17 Field Support Service, including project management and
18 real property administration (including leases, site acquisi-
19 tion and disposal activities directly supporting projects),
20 shall be provided to Department of Veterans Affairs com-
21 ponents only on a reimbursable basis, and such amounts
22 will remain available until September 30, 2006: *Provided*
23 *further*, That no appropriations from this account shall be
24 available for the purchase of any site for or toward the
25 construction of any new hospital or home: *Provided fur-*
26 *ther*, That no appropriations in this account shall be avail-

1 able for hospitalization or examination of any persons (ex-
2 cept beneficiaries entitled under the laws bestowing such
3 benefits to veterans, and persons receiving such treatment
4 under 5 U.S.C.7901–7904 or 42 U.S.C. 5141–5204), un-
5 less reimbursement of cost is made to the “Medical care”
6 account at such rates as may be fixed by the Secretary
7 of Veterans Affairs: *Provided further*, That no appropria-
8 tions in this account shall be available to enter into any
9 new lease of real property if the estimated annual rental
10 is more than \$300,000 unless the Secretary submits a re-
11 port which the Committees on Appropriations of the Con-
12 gress approve within 30 days following the date on which
13 the report is received: *Provided further*, That amounts de-
14 ducted from enhanced-use lease proceeds to reimburse an
15 account for expenses incurred by that account during a
16 prior fiscal year for providing enhanced-use lease services,
17 may be obligated during the fiscal year in which the pro-
18 ceeds are received.

19 DEPARTMENTAL ADMINISTRATION

20 GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES

21 For necessary operating expenses of the Department
22 of Veterans Affairs, not otherwise provided for, including
23 administrative expenses in support of Department-wide
24 capital planning, management and policy activities, uni-
25 forms or allowances therefor; not to exceed \$25,000 for

1 official reception and representation expenses; hire of pas-
2 senger motor vehicles; and reimbursement of the General
3 Services Administration for security guard services, and
4 the Department of Defense for the cost of overseas em-
5 ployee mail, \$1,375,000,000: *Provided*, That expenses for
6 services and assistance authorized under 38 U.S.C.
7 3104(a)(1), (2), (5), and (11) that the Secretary deter-
8 mines are necessary to enable entitled veterans: (1) to the
9 maximum extent feasible, to become employable and to ob-
10 tain and maintain suitable employment; or (2) to achieve
11 maximum independence in daily living, shall be charged
12 to this account: *Provided further*, That the Veterans Bene-
13 fits Administration shall be funded at not less than
14 \$1,086,250,000: *Provided further*, That of the funds made
15 available under this heading, not to exceed \$69,000,000
16 shall be available for obligation until September 30, 2006:
17 *Provided further*, That from the funds made available
18 under this heading, the Veterans Benefits Administration
19 may purchase up to two passenger motor vehicles for use
20 in operations of that Administration in Manila, Phil-
21ippines: *Provided further*, That no appropriations from
22 this account shall be available for the purchase of any site
23 for or toward the construction of any new hospital or
24 home: *Provided further*, That no appropriations in this ac-
25 count shall be available for hospitalization or examination

1 of any persons (except beneficiaries entitled under the
2 laws bestowing such benefits to veterans, and persons re-
3 ceiving such treatment under 5 U.S.C. 7901–7904 or 42
4 U.S.C. 5141–5204), unless reimbursement of cost is made
5 to the “Medical care” account at such rates as may be
6 fixed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs: *Provided fur-*
7 *ther*, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law,
8 during fiscal year 2005, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs
9 shall, from the National Service Life Insurance Fund (38
10 U.S.C. 1920), the Veterans’ Special Life Insurance Fund
11 (38 U.S.C. 1923), and the United States Government Life
12 Insurance Fund (38 U.S.C. 1955), reimburse this account
13 for the cost of administration of the insurance programs
14 financed through those accounts: *Provided further*, That
15 reimbursement of funds mentioned in the previous proviso
16 shall be made only from the surplus earnings accumulated
17 in an insurance program in fiscal year 2005 that are avail-
18 able for dividends in that program after claims have been
19 paid and actuarially determined reserves have been set
20 aside: *Provided further*, That if the cost of administration
21 of an insurance program exceeds the amount of surplus
22 earning accumulated in that program, reimbursement to
23 this account shall be made only to the extent of such sur-
24 plus earnings: *Provided further*, That the Secretary shall
25 determine the cost of administration of an insurance pro-

1 gram for fiscal year 2005 which is properly allocable to
2 the provision of each insurance program and to the provi-
3 sion of any total disability income insurance included in
4 such insurance program: *Provided further*, That funds
5 available in this appropriation for fiscal year 2005 shall
6 be available to reimburse the Office of Resolution Manage-
7 ment and the Office of Employment Discrimination Com-
8 plaint Adjudication for all services provided at rates which
9 will recover actual costs: *Provided further*, That payments
10 may be made in advance for services to be furnished by
11 the Office of Resolution Management and the Office of
12 Employment Discrimination Complaint Adjudication
13 based on estimated costs: *Provided further*, That amounts
14 received from the aforementioned offices shall be credited
15 to this account for use by the office that provided the serv-
16 ice: *Provided further*, That no appropriations in this ac-
17 count shall be available to enter into any new lease of real
18 property if the estimated annual rental is more than
19 \$300,000 unless the Secretary submits a report which the
20 Committees on Appropriations of the Congress approve
21 within 30 days following the date on which the report is
22 received: *Provided further*, That amounts deducted from
23 enhanced-use lease proceeds to reimburse an account for
24 expenses incurred by that account during a prior fiscal
25 year for providing enhanced-use lease services, may be ob-

1 ligated during the fiscal year in which the proceeds are
2 received.

3 NATIONAL CEMETERY ADMINISTRATION

4 For necessary expenses of the National Cemetery Ad-
5 ministration for operations and maintenance, not other-
6 wise provided for, including uniforms or allowances there-
7 for; cemeterial expenses as authorized by law; purchase
8 of one passenger motor vehicle for use in cemeterial oper-
9 ations; and hire of passenger motor vehicles,
10 \$199,000,000; *Provided*, That of the funds made available
11 under this heading, not to exceed \$9,950,000, shall be
12 available until September 30, 2006: *Provided further*, That
13 no appropriations from this account shall be available for
14 the purchase of any site for or toward the construction
15 of any new hospital or home: *Provided further*, That no
16 appropriations in this account shall be available to enter
17 into any new lease of real property if the estimated annual
18 rental is more than \$300,000 unless the Secretary submits
19 a report which the Committees on Appropriations of the
20 Congress approve within 30 days following the date on
21 which the report is received.

22 OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL

23 For necessary expenses of the Office of Inspector
24 General in carrying out the provisions of the Inspector
25 General Act of 1978, as amended, \$65,000,000, to remain
26 available until September 30, 2006.

CONSTRUCTION, MAJOR PROJECTS

For constructing, altering, extending and improving any of the facilities including parking projects under the jurisdiction or for the use of the Department of Veterans Affairs, or for any of the purposes set forth in sections 316, 2404, 2406, 8102, 8103, 8106, 8108, 8109, 8110, and 8122 of title 38, United States Code, including planning, architectural and engineering services, maintenance or guarantee period services costs associated with equipment guarantees provided under the project, services of claims analysts, offsite utility and storm drainage system construction costs, and site acquisition, where the estimated cost of a project is more than the amount set forth in 38 U.S.C. 8104(a)(3)(A) or where funds for a project were made available in a previous major project appropriation, \$401,000,000 to remain available until expended, of which \$10,000,000 shall be to make reimbursements as provided in 41 U.S.C. 612 for claims paid for contract disputes: *Provided*, That except for advance planning activities, including needs assessments which may or may not lead to capital investments, and other capital asset management related activities, such as portfolio development and management activities, and investment strategy studies funded through the advance planning fund and the planning and design activities funded through the design

1 fund and the Capital Asset Realignment for Enhanced
2 Services (CARES) funds, including needs assessments
3 which may or may not lead to capital investments, none
4 of the funds appropriated under this heading shall be used
5 for any project which has not been approved by the Con-
6 gress in the budgetary process: *Provided further*, That
7 funds provided in this appropriation for fiscal year 2005,
8 for each approved project (except those for CARES activi-
9 ties referenced above) shall be obligated: (1) by the award-
10 ing of a construction documents contract by September
11 30, 2005; and (2) by the awarding of a construction con-
12 tract by September 30, 2006: *Provided further*, That, not-
13 withstanding any other provision of law, the CARES ac-
14 tivities may include long-term care, domiciliary care and
15 outpatient mental health care: *Provided further*, That, the
16 Secretary shall provide a report in writing to the Commit-
17 tees by January 5, 2005, on how such funds, referenced
18 in the previous proviso are allocated: *Provided further*,
19 That the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall promptly re-
20 port in writing to the Committees on Appropriations any
21 approved major construction project in which obligations
22 are not incurred within the time limitations established
23 above: *Provided further*, That no appropriations in this ac-
24 count shall be available to enter into any new lease of real
25 property if the estimated annual rental is more than

1 \$300,000 unless the Secretary submits a report which the
2 Committees on Appropriations of the Congress approve
3 within 30 days following the date on which the report is
4 received: *Provided further*, That amounts deducted from
5 enhanced-use lease proceeds to reimburse an account for
6 expenses incurred by that account during a prior fiscal
7 year for providing enhanced-use lease services, may be ob-
8 ligated during the fiscal year in which the proceeds are
9 received.

10 CONSTRUCTION, MINOR PROJECTS

11 For constructing, altering, extending, and improving
12 any of the facilities including parking projects under the
13 jurisdiction or for the use of the Department of Veterans
14 Affairs, including planning and assessments of needs
15 which may lead to capital investments, architectural and
16 engineering services, maintenance or guarantee period
17 services costs associated with equipment guarantees pro-
18 vided under the project, services of claims analysts, offsite
19 utility and storm drainage system construction costs, and
20 site acquisition, or for any of the purposes set forth in
21 sections 316, 2404, 2406, 8102, 8103, 8106, 8108, 8109,
22 8110, 8122, and 8162 of title 38, United States Code,
23 where the estimated cost of a project is equal to or less
24 than the amount set forth in 38 U.S.C. 8104(a)(3)(A),
25 \$182,000,000, to remain available until expended, along
26 with unobligated balances of previous “Construction,

1 minor projects'' appropriations which are hereby made
2 available for any project where the estimated cost is less
3 than the amount set forth in 38 U.S.C. 8104(a)(3)(A):
4 *Provided*, That from amounts appropriated under this
5 heading, additional amounts may be used for CARES ac-
6 tivities upon notification of and approval by the Commit-
7 tees on Appropriations: *Provided further*, That funds in
8 this account shall be available for: (1) repairs to any of
9 the nonmedical facilities under the jurisdiction or for the
10 use of the Department which are necessary because of loss
11 or damage caused by any natural disaster or catastrophe;
12 and (2) temporary measures necessary to prevent or to
13 minimize further loss by such causes: *Provided further*,
14 That no appropriations in this account shall be available
15 to enter into any new lease of real property if the esti-
16 mated annual rental is more than \$300,000 unless the
17 Secretary submits a report which the Committees on Ap-
18 propriations of the Congress approve within 30 days fol-
19 lowing the date on which the report is received: *Provided*
20 *further*, That amounts deducted from enhanced-use lease
21 proceeds to reimburse an account for expenses incurred
22 by that account during a prior fiscal year for providing
23 enhanced-use lease services, may be obligated during the
24 fiscal year in which the proceeds are received.

1 PARKING REVOLVING FUND

2 For the parking revolving fund as authorized by 38
3 U.S.C. 8109, income from fees collected, to remain avail-
4 able until expended, which shall be available for all author-
5 ized expenses except operations and maintenance costs,
6 which will be funded from “Medical care”: *Provided*, That
7 no appropriations in this account shall be available to
8 enter into any new lease of real property if the estimated
9 annual rental is more than \$300,000 unless the Secretary
10 submits a report which the Committees on Appropriations
11 of the Congress approve within 30 days following the date
12 on which the report is received.

13 GRANTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STATE EXTENDED CARE
14 FACILITIES

15 For grants to assist States to acquire or construct
16 State nursing home and domiciliary facilities and to re-
17 model, modify or alter existing hospital, nursing home and
18 domiciliary facilities in State homes, for furnishing care
19 to veterans as authorized by 38 U.S.C. 8131–8137,
20 \$105,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Pro-*
21 *vided*, That no appropriations from this account shall be
22 available for the purchase of any site for or toward the
23 construction of any new hospital or home: *Provided fur-*
24 *ther*, That no appropriations in this account shall be avail-
25 able to enter into any new lease of real property if the
26 estimated annual rental is more than \$300,000 unless the

1 Secretary submits a report which the Committees on Ap-
2 propriations of the Congress approve within 30 days fol-
3 lowing the date on which the report is received.

4 GRANTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STATE VETERANS
5 CEMETERIES

6 For grants to aid States in establishing, expanding,
7 or improving State veterans cemeteries as authorized by
8 38 U.S.C. 2408, \$32,000,000, to remain available until
9 expended: *Provided*, That no appropriations from this ac-
10 count shall be available for the purchase of any site for
11 or toward the construction of any new hospital or home:
12 *Provided further*, That no appropriations in this account
13 shall be available to enter into any new lease of real prop-
14 erty if the estimated annual rental is more than \$300,000
15 unless the Secretary submits a report which the Commit-
16 tees on Appropriations of the Congress approve within 30
17 days following the date on which the report is received.

18 ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

19 SEC. 101. Notwithstanding any other provision of
20 law, the Department of Veterans Affairs shall continue the
21 Franchise fund pilot program authorized to be established
22 by section 403 of Public Law 103–356 until October 1,
23 2005: *Provided*, That the Franchise Fund, established by
24 title I of Public Law 104–204 to finance the operations
25 of the Franchise Fund pilot program, shall continue until
26 October 1, 2005.

11 (2) annual income information for purposes of
12 section 1722 of such title.

14 In the case of taxpayers with adjusted gross income
15 in excess of \$1,000,000 for calendar year 2004, the
16 amount of the tax reduction resulting from enactment of
17 the Jobs and Growth Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of
18 2003 (Public Law 108-27) and enactment of the Eco-
19 nomic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001
20 (Public Law 107-16) shall be reduced by 5.1 percent.

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
