Making appropriations for military construction and family housing for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes.

Mr. EDWARDS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

Making appropriations for military construction and family housing for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for
5 military construction and family housing functions admin-
6 istered by the Department of Defense for the fiscal year
7 ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes,
8 namely:

1 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY

2 For acquisition, construction, installation and equip-
3 ment of temporary or permanent public works, military
4 installations, facilities and real property for the Army as
5 currently authorized by law, including personnel in the
6 Army Corps of Engineers and other personal services nec-
7 essary for the purposes of this appropriation, and for con-
8 struction and operation of facilities in support of the func-
9 tions of the Commander in Chief, \$2,567,743,000, to re-
10 main available until September 30, 2009: *Provided*, That
11 of this amount not to exceed \$223,740,000 shall be avail-
12 able for study, planning, design, architect and engineer
13 services and host nation support, as authorized by law,
14 unless the Secretary of Defense determines that additional
15 obligations are necessary for such purposes and notifies
16 the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Con-
17 gress of his determination and the reasons therefor.

18 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVY

19 For acquisition, construction, installation and equip-
20 ment of temporary or permanent public works, naval in-
21 stallations, facilities and real property for the Navy as cur-
22 rently authorized by law, including personnel in the Naval
23 Facilities Engineering Command and other personal serv-
24 ices necessary for the purposes of this appropriation,
25 \$1,377,577,000 to remain available until September 30,

1 2009: *Provided*, That of this amount not to exceed
2 \$115,896,000 shall be available for study, planning, de-
3 sign, architect and engineer services, as authorized by law,
4 unless the Secretary of Defense determines that additional
5 obligations are necessary for such purposes and notifies
6 the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Con-
7 gress of his determination and the reasons therefor.

8 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE

9 For acquisition, construction, installation and equip-
10 ment of temporary or permanent public works, military
11 installations, facilities and real property for the Air Force
12 as currently authorized by law, \$915,733,000, to remain
13 available until September 30, 2009: *Provided*, That of this
14 amount not to exceed \$164,924,000 shall be available for
15 study, planning, design, architect and engineer services,
16 as authorized by law, unless the Secretary of Defense de-
17 termines that additional obligations are necessary for such
18 purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations
19 of both Houses of Congress of his determination and the
20 reasons therefor.

21 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE RESERVE

22 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
23 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
24 ministration of the Air Force Reserve as currently author-
25 ized by chapter 1803 of title 10, United States Code, and

1 Military Construction Authorization Acts, \$929,483,000,
2 to remain available until September 30, 2009: *Provided*,
3 That of this amount not to exceed \$164,924,000 shall be
4 available for study, planning, design, architect and engi-
5 neer services, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary
6 of Defense determines that additional obligations are nec-
7 essary for such purposes and notifies the Committees on
8 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of his deter-
9 mination and the reasons therefor.

10 FAMILY HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, ARMY

11 For expenses of family housing for the Army for con-
12 struction, including acquisition, replacement, addition, ex-
13 pansion, extension and alteration, as authorized by law,
14 \$728,112,000, to remain available until September 30,
15 2009.

16 FAMILY HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, NAVY AND MARINE
17 CORPS

18 For expenses of family housing for the Navy and Ma-
19 rine Corps for construction, including acquisition, replace-
20 ment, addition, expansion, extension and alteration, as au-
21 thorized by law, \$159,229,000, to remain available until
22 September 30, 2009.

23 FAMILY HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE

24 For expenses of family housing for the Air Force for
25 construction, including acquisition, replacement, addition,

1 expansion, extension and alteration, as authorized by law,
2 \$969,474,000, to remain available until September 30,
3 2009.

4 OFFSET

5 In the case of taxpayers with adjusted gross income
6 in excess of \$1,000,000 for calendar year 2004, the
7 amount of the tax reduction resulting from enactment of
8 the Jobs and Growth Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of
9 2003 (Public Law 108–27) and enactment of the Eco-
10 nomic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001
11 (Public Law 107–16) shall be reduced by 6.3 percent.

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
