4 of title 10, United States Code, shall not apply with re-
5 spect to the posthumous award of the Congressional Medal

1 of Honor under section 6241 of such title to Doris Miller
2 (service number 356–12–35) for acts of heroism during
3 World War II while a member of the United States Navy.
