3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "War Funding Account-
- 5 ability Act".

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1 SEC. 2. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

5 deployment rotation and other relief for United
6 States troops serving Iraq, including efforts to con7 struct improved living quarters for those United
8 States troops; and

9 (6) an assessment of the remaining needs with 10 respect to military operations in Iraq and the recon-11 struction of Iraq, including a description of addi-12 tional funding required to meet these needs, if nec-13 essary.

14 SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.

15 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if the requirement to transmit an initial report under section 2(a)16 is not met, or the requirement to transmit a subsequent 17 report under section 2(b) is not met, then amounts for 18 19 the reconstruction of Iraq available under an Act described 20 in section 2 with respect to which the report relates, or 21 available under any other provision of law, that are unobli-22 gated or unexpended may not be obligated or expended 23 (as the case may be) until the report is transmitted to 24 Congress.
