A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for human embryonic stem cell research.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stem Cell Research
- 5 Enhancement Act of 2004".

SEC. 2. HUMAN EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH.

- 2 Part H of title IV of the Public Health Service Act
- 3 (42 U.S.C. 289 et seq.) is amended by inserting after sec-
- 4 tion 498C the following:
- 5 "SEC. 498D. HUMAN EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH.
- 6 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
- 7 vision of law, the Secretary shall conduct and support re-
- 8 search that utilizes human embryonic stem cells in accord-
- 9 ance with this section.
- 10 "(b) Requirements.—The Secretary shall conduct
- 11 or support research that utilizes human embryonic stem
- 12 cells if the following requirements are met:
- "(1) The stem cells were derived from human
- embryos that have been donated from in vitro fer-
- tilization clinics, were created for the purposes of
- 16 fertility treatment, and were in excess of the clinical
- 17 need of the individuals seeking such treatment.
- 18 "(2) Prior to the consideration of embryo dona-
- tion and through consultation with the individuals
- seeking fertility treatment, it is determined that the
- embryos will never be implanted in a woman and
- would otherwise be discarded.
- 23 "(3) The individuals seeking fertility treatment
- donated the embryos with written informed consent
- and without receiving any financial or other induce-
- 26 ments to make the donation.

- 1 "(c) Guidelines.—Not later than 60 days after the
- 2 date of the enactment of this section, the Secretary, in
- 3 consultation with the Director of NIH, shall promulgate
- 4 guidelines to carry out this section.
- 5 "(d) Determination.—In determining whether this
- 6 section authorizes or prohibits the conduct or support of
- 7 research using a particular human embryonic stem cell
- 8 line, the Secretary—
- 9 "(1) shall apply the requirements of subsection
- 10 (b) regardless of the date on which the stem cell line
- is derived from a human embryo; and
- 12 "(2) shall apply the guidelines promulgated
- under this section only if the stem cell line is derived
- from a human embryo on or after the date described
- in subsection (c).
- 16 "(e) Reporting Requirements.—The Secretary
- 17 shall annually prepare and submit to the appropriate com-
- 18 mittees of the Congress a report describing the activities
- 19 carried out under this section during the preceding fiscal
- 20 year, and including a description of whether and to what
- 21 extent research under subsection (a) has been conducted
- 22 in accordance with this section.".
