## A BILL

To clarify the obligations of the Federal Communications Commission to issue licenses using competitive bidding procedures.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Spectrum Account-
- 5 ability Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF SPECTRUM AUCTION REQUIRE-
- 7 MENTS.
- 8 (a) Amendment.—Paragraph (6) of section 309(j)
- 9 of the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 309(j)(6))
- 10 is amended—

1	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (A) through
2	(H) as clauses (i) through (viii), respectively;
3	(2) by striking "Nothing in this subsection"
4	and inserting the following:
5	"(A) In General.—Nothing in this sub-
6	section"; and
7	(3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
8	paragraph:
9	"(B) Limitation.—Neither subparagraph
10	(A) of this paragraph nor any other provision
11	of this Act (other than paragraph (2) of this
12	subsection) shall be construed to permit the
13	Commission to avoid the requirement of para-
14	graph (1) of this subsection to use competitive
15	bidding in granting a license, or to avoid the
16	obligation to accept properly executed mutually
17	exclusive applications for such a license, if the
18	grant of such license, including any grant by
19	means of a modification pursuant to section
20	316, results in the licensee—
21	"(i) being authorized to use—
22	"(I) a materially greater quantity
23	of electromagnetic spectrum than the
24	licensee was authorized to use prior to
25	the grant or modification; or

1	"(II) a band of the electro-
2	magnetic spectrum that materially ex-
3	ceeds in value any band of spectrum
4	that was previously used by the li-
5	censee; or
6	"(ii) effectively exchanging a license
7	previously held by the licensee for a license
8	that—
9	"(I) materially alters the rights
10	or obligations under the previously
11	held license; or
12	"(II) permits the licensee to pro-
13	vide services that the previously held
14	license did not permit.".
