## A BILL

To maintain and expand the steel import licensing and monitoring program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MAINTENANCE AND EXPANSION OF STEEL IM-
- 4 PORT LICENSING AND MONITORING PRO-
- 5 GRAM.
- 6 (a) Maintenance of Program.—The steel import
- 7 licensing and monitoring program established by the Sec-
- 8 retary of the Treasury and the Secretary of Commerce
- 9 pursuant to the Memorandum signed by the President on
- 10 March 5, 2002 (67 Fed. Reg. 10593 through 10597) (pur-
- 11 suant to the authority of the President under section

- 1 203(g) of the Trade Act of 1974), shall, notwithstanding
- 2 any other action taken by the President under section 203
- 3 of the Trade Act of 1974 concerning the steel products
- 4 described in the Memorandum, remain in effect and be
- 5 established by the Secretary of Commerce as a permanent
- 6 program.

### 7 (b) Expansion of Program.—

- (1) In General.—In carrying out the program in accordance with subsection (a), the Secretary of the Treasury and the Secretary of Commerce shall expand the program to include all iron and steel, and all articles of iron or steel, described in paragraph (2). The import and licensing data made available to the public as part of this program shall be released based upon classifications at the tenth digit level of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States.
  - (2) Iron and steel Described.—The iron and steel, and articles of iron or steel, referred to in subparagraph (A) are the iron and steel, and articles of iron or steel, contained in the following headings and subheadings of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States:
- 24 (A) Each of the headings 7206 through 25 7229 (relating to mill products).

1	(B) Each of the headings 7301 through
2	7307 (relating to rails, structurals, pipe and
3	tubes, and fittings and flanges).
4	(C) Heading 7308 (relating to fabricated
5	structurals).
6	(D) Subheading 7310.10.00 (relating to
7	barrels and drums).
8	(E) Heading 7312 (relating to strand and
9	rope).
10	(F) Heading 7313.00.00 (relating to
11	barbed and fence wire).
12	(G) Headings 7314, 7315, and 7317.00
13	(relating to fabricated wire).
14	(H) Heading 7318 (relating to industrial
15	fasteners).
16	(I) Heading 7326 (relating to fence posts).
17	(c) Additional Authority.—The Secretary of the
18	Treasury and the Secretary of Commerce are hereby au-
19	thorized and directed to take such actions as are nec-
20	essary—
21	(1) to maintain the program described in sub-
22	section (a) in accordance with such subsection; and
23	(2) to expand, as necessary and appropriate,
24	such program in accordance with subsection (b).
