A BILL

To provide funding for the operations and maintenance by the Corps of Engineers of essential waterways.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Essential Waterways
- 5 Operations and Maintenance Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. ESSENTIAL WATERWAYS OPERATIONS AND MAINTE-
- 7 NANCE.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—For each fiscal year, there shall
- 9 be available to the Secretary of the Army, acting through

- 1 the Chief of Engineers, for operations and maintenance
- 2 of essential waterways 5 percent of the amount of duties
- 3 collected during the preceding fiscal year on articles trans-
- 4 ported by vessel unladen for purposes of entering the cus-
- 5 toms territory of the United States.
- 6 (b) Selection Criteria for Essential Water-
- 7 WAYS.—For purposes of this section, an essential water-
- 8 way is a waterway that—
- 9 (1) the Secretary of the Army determines pro-
- vides service to one of the 25 highest ranked United
- 11 States ports in terms of total tonnage of cargo
- transported through the port;
- 13 (2) the Secretary of Energy, in consultation
- 14 with the Secretary of Homeland Security, deter-
- mines is a critical component of the United States
- 16 energy infrastructure; and
- 17 (3)(A) the Secretary of Homeland Security de-
- termines provides service to at least one militarily
- and economically strategic port; or
- 20 (B) the Secretary of Transportation determines
- 21 provides service to at least one commercially stra-
- tegic port.
- (c) Maintenance of Effort.—Amounts made
- 24 available to the Secretary of the Army pursuant to sub-

- 1 section (a) are in addition to amounts otherwise made
- 2 available to the Secretary for operations and maintenance.
- 3 (d) Definitions.—For purposes of this section, the
- 4 following terms apply:
- 5 (1) Customs territory of the united
- 6 STATES.—The term "customs territory of the United
- 7 States" has the meaning given that term in general
- 8 note 2 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
- 9 United States.
- 10 (2) Vessel.—The term "vessel" has the mean-
- ing given that term in section 401 of the Tariff Act
- of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1401).
