A BILL

To amend the Tariff Act of 1930 to clarify the adjustments
to be made in determining export price and constructed
export price.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Duty Parity Act of
5 2003”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPORT PRICE AND CONSTRUCTED EXPORT PRICE.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 772(c)(2)(A) of the Tariff
8 Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1677a(c)(2)(A)) is amended by

1 inserting “(including countervailing duties imposed under
2 this Act)” after “duties”.

3 (b) APPLICATION TO CANADA AND MEXICO.—Pursu-
4 ant to article 1902 of the North American Free Trade
5 Agreement and section 408 of the North American Free
6 Trade Agreement Implementation Act, the amendment
7 made by this section shall apply with respect to goods from
8 Canada and Mexico.

9 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 this section shall apply with respect to determinations
11 made under title VII of the Tariff Act of 1930 that—

12 (1) are made with respect to investigations ini-
13 tiated or petitions filed after the date of enactment
14 of this section; or

15 (2) have not become final as of the date of en-
16 actment of this section.
