A BILL

To require the annual poverty estimate and the National Assessment of Educational Progress to be subject to certain guidance on the release of information to the public.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO PUBLIC RELEASE OF ANNUAL POVERTY ESTIMATE AND
 NATIONAL ASSESSMENT OF EDUCATIONAL
 PROGRESS.

 (a) IN GENERAL.—The annual poverty estimate and
- 8 the National Assessment of Educational Progress shall be

- 1 treated as if they were principal economic indicators and
- 2 subject to the provisions of the Statistical Policy Directive
- 3 on Compilation, Release, and Evaluation of Principal Fed-
- 4 eral Economic Indicators of the Office of Management and
- 5 Budget (50 Fed. Reg. 38932; September 25, 1985).
- 6 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
- 7 (1) The term "annual poverty estimate" means 8 the Annual Demographic Supplement to the March 9 Current Population Survey, or any successor docu-10 ment that is the basis for the official national esti-11 mate of the levels of poverty, of the Bureau of the 12 Census.
 - (2) The term "National Assessment of Educational Progress" means the National Assessment of Educational Progress established pursuant to section 303 of the National Assessment of Educational Progress Authorization Act (title II of the Act of November 5, 2002; Public Law 107–279).

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
