- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "E-mail Privacy Protec-
- 5 tion Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. INTERCEPTION OF ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS
- 7 DURING TRANSMISSION.
- 8 Section 2510(12) of title 18, United States Code, is
- 9 amended by inserting "and includes any temporary, inter-

- 1 mediate storage of that communication incidental to the
- 2 electronic transmission thereof," after "commerce,".
- 3 SEC. 3. IMPROPER ACQUISITION OF CONTENTS OF STORED
- 4 ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS BY ELEC-
- 5 TRONIC COMMUNICATIONS PROVIDERS.
- 6 Section 2701 of title 18, United States Code, is
- 7 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 8 "(d) Improper Acquisition by Service Pro-
- 9 VIDER.—Whoever, being a provider of an electronic com-
- 10 munication service, or an agent or employee of such a pro-
- 11 vider, acquires or uses the contents of a stored electronic
- 12 communication of which that provider, agent, or employee
- 13 is not an intended recipient other than for the purposes
- 14 of providing that electronic communication service, shall
- 15 be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 5
- 16 years, or both.".
