Mr. Dooley of California (for himself and Mr. Frelinghuysen) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

## A BILL

To improve the operation and utilization of the United States National Arboretum in the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "U.S. National Arbo-
- 5 return Appreciation Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. PARTNERING AGREEMENTS TO EXPAND OPER-
- 7 ATION AND USE OF UNITED STATES NA-
- 8 TIONAL ARBORETUM.
- 9 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

- 1 (1) The United States National Arboretum,
  2 which is located in the District of Columbia and is
  3 operated by the Agriculture Research Service of the
  4 Department of Agriculture, is nationally and inter5 nationally recognized for its outstanding research
  6 and public education contributions.
  - (2) However, the National Arboretum has been under-utilized by the public, thereby creating a need for greater visibility, awareness, and use of the National Arboretum.
  - (3) Expanded use of the National Arboretum would bring increased financial support, public recognition, and appreciation of the facility and its research and education functions.
  - (4) The Friends of the National Arboretum is a private nonprofit organization whose mission is solely the support and promotion of the National Arboretum.
  - (5) A congressional oversight hearing in 2003 highlighted the bipartisan consensus for greater outreach and fund-raising events to be conducted at the National Arboretum through the Friends of the National Arboretum.
  - (6) At a time of extreme budget constraints, many Federal agencies are permitting the use of

- their buildings and facilities for private functions and special events that raise funds to supplement appropriated funds.
- 4 (7) Despite encouragement from Congress, the 5 Secretary of Agriculture has not taken adequate 6 steps to improve the accessibility and use of the Na-7 tional Arboretum.
- 8 (b) Partnering Agreement With the Friends
  9 of the National Arboretum.—Not later than 30 days
  10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
  11 of Agriculture shall enter into a contract with the Friends
  12 of the National Arboretum, either through a sole-source
  13 contract or other method, to authorize the Friends of the
  14 National Arboretum to act as agent of the Department
  15 of Agriculture for the purpose of—
- 16 (1) allowing the use of the grounds and facili-17 ties of the National Arboretum by private persons 18 and entities;
- 19 (2) providing services related to planning and 20 overseeing special events at the National Arboretum; 21 and
- (3) making such other arrangements as appro priate for the private use of the National Arboretum.
- 24 (c) Additional Contract Authority.—The Sec-25 retary of Agriculture may enter into contracts with other

- 1 persons or entities for the private use of the grounds and
- 2 facilities of the National Arboretum so long as such con-
- 3 tracts do not conflict with the contract with the Friends
- 4 of the National Arboretum.
- 5 (d) Effect of Failure to Comply.—If the con-
- 6 tract required by subsection (b) is not entered into by the
- 7 end of the 30-day period specified in such subsection, the
- 8 contract proposal submitted to the Department of Agri-
- 9 culture by the Friends of the National Arboretum on Jan-
- 10 uary 13, 2004, shall be deemed to be a legal and binding
- 11 sole-source contract between the Secretary of Agriculture
- 12 and the Friends of the National Arboretum for a period
- 13 of five years, effective beginning at the end of such 30-
- 14 day period. The Secretary shall publish a copy of the con-
- 15 tract proposal in the Federal Register as soon as prac-
- 16 ticable after the contract proposal takes legal effect pursu-
- 17 ant to this subsection. The contract proposal may be
- 18 amended or extended by the mutual agreement of the par-
- 19 ties.
