- 6 **OPEN-AIR NUCLEAR TESTING.**

7 Section 1112(c) of title 38, United States Code, is
8 amended—

(1) in paragraph (3)(B)(i), by inserting before
 the period at the end the following: "or exposure to
 ionzing radiation due to residual contamination re sulting from such a detonation"; and

5 (2) by adding at the end the following new6 paragraph:

7 "(4) For purposes of paragraph (3)(B)(i), onsite par-8 ticipation by any individual in a test involving the atmos-9 pheric detonation of a nuclear device and any exposure 10 to ionzing radiation due to residual contamination result-11 ing from such a detonation shall be determined without 12 regard to whether any particular level of radiation expo-13 sure was measured for that individual.".
