- 3 SECTION 1. PILOT STUDY TO MOVE WARNING SYSTEMS
- 4 INTO THE MODERN DIGITAL AGE.
- 5 (a) PILOT STUDY.—The Attorney General and Sec-
- 6 retary of Homeland Security, from funds available for im-
- 7 proving the national system to notify the general public
- 8 in the event of a terrorist attack, and in consultation with

- 1 the heads of other appropriate Federal agencies, the Na-
- 2 tional Association of State Chief Information Officers, and
- 3 other stakeholders with respect to public warning systems,
- 4 shall conduct a pilot study under which the Secretary may
- 5 issue public warnings regarding threats to homeland secu-
- 6 rity using an AMBER Alert system.
- 7 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 9 months after the date
- 8 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit
- 9 to the Congress a report regarding the findings, conclu-
- 10 sions, and recommendations of the pilot study.
