## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit certain interstate conduct relating to captive mammals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Captive Mammal Pro-
- 5 tection Act of 2004".

# SEC. 2. TRANSPORT OR POSSESSION OF CAPTIVE MAM MALS FOR PURPOSES OF KILLING OR INJUR ING THEM.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 3 of title 18, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol6 lowing:

## 7 "§ 49. Captive mammals

8 "(a) PROHIBITION.—Whoever, in or affecting inter-9 state or foreign commerce, knowingly transfers, trans-10 ports, or possesses a captive mammal, for the purposes 11 of allowing the killing or injuring of that mammal for en-12 tertainment or for the collection of a trophy, shall be fined 13 under this title, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both.

14 "(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

15 "(1) the term 'captive mammal' means a mam16 mal that has been held in captivity, whether or not
17 the defendant knows the length of the captivity, for
18 the shorter of—

- 19 "(A) the majority of the animal's life; or
- 20 "(B) a period of 1 year; and

21 "(2) the term 'captivity' does not include any
22 period during which an animal lives as it would in
23 the wild—

24 "(A) surviving primarily by foraging for
25 naturally occurring food;

1	"(B) roaming at will over an open area of
2	not less than 1,000 acres; and
3	"(C) having the opportunity to avoid hunt-
4	ers.".
5	(b) Conforming Amendment.—The table of sec-
6	tions at the beginning of chapter 3 of title 18, United
7	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
8	lowing new item:

"49 Captive mammals.".
