## A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a Department of Veterans Affairs Community-Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC) for veterans on the grounds of the Navy Supply Corps School in Athens, Georgia.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMU-**  
4                       **NITY-BASED OUTPATIENT CLINIC, NAVY SUP-**  
5                       **PLY CORPS SCHOOL, ATHENS, GEORGIA.**

6       (a) PROJECT AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary of  
7 Veterans Affairs is authorized—

1           (1) to work with the Secretary of the Navy in  
2       developing on the grounds of the Navy Supply Corps  
3       School in Athens, Georgia, a site suitable for a med-  
4       ical facility; and

5           (2) to construct on that site a joint Navy-De-  
6       partment of Veterans Affairs Community-Based  
7       Outpatient Clinic, as called for in the Capital Asset  
8       Realignment for Enhanced Services (CARES) stra-  
9       tegic plan approved by the Secretary of Veterans Af-  
10      fairs.

11      (b) FUNDING.—There are authorized to be appro-  
12     priated such sums as may be necessary for the purposes  
13     of subsection (a).

14      (c) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section:

15           (1) The term “medical facility” has the mean-  
16       ing given that term in section 8101(3) of title 38,  
17       United States Code.

18           (2) The term “Community-Based Outpatient  
19       Clinic” has the meaning given that term in the De-  
20       partment of Veterans Affairs’ Capital Asset Realign-  
21       ment for Enhanced Services (CARES) strategic  
22       plan.
