A BILL

To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to require staff working with developmentally disabled individuals to call emergency services in the event of a life-threatening situation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT OF STAFF WORKING WITH DE
VELOPMENTALLY DISABLED PERSONS TO

CALL EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE EVENT

OF A LIFE-THREATENING SITUATION.

(a) REQUIREMENT.—Section 1902(a) of the Social

Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (66), by striking "and" at the
2	end;
3	(2) in paragraph (67), by striking the period at
4	the end and inserting "; and; and
5	(3) by inserting after paragraph (67) the fol-
6	lowing new paragraph:
7	"(68) provide, in accordance with regulations of
8	the Secretary, that direct care staff providing
9	health-related services to a person with a develop-
10	mental disability or traumatic brain injury are re-
11	quired to call the 911 emergency telephone service
12	or equivalent emergency management service for as-
13	sistance in the event of a life-threatening emergency
14	to such person and to report such call to the appro-
15	priate State agency or department.".
16	(b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
17	subsection (a) take effect on January 1, 2006.
