1	SECTION 1. DENIAL OF FOREIGN TAX CREDIT FOR TAXES
2	PAID TO SUDAN UNTIL STEPS ARE TAKEN TO
3	END GENOCIDE.
4	Section 901(j)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of
5	1986 is amended by adding at the end the following new
6	subparagraph:
7	"(C) Special rule for sudan.—In addi-
8	tion to any period during which this subsection
9	would otherwise apply to Sudan, this subsection
10	shall apply to Sudan during the period—
11	"(i) beginning on the date of the en-
12	actment of this subparagraph, and
13	"(ii) ending on the date the Secretary
14	of State determines and certifies to the
15	Secretary of the Treasury that the Govern-
16	ment of Sudan has ceased to support acts
17	of genocide in the Darfur region of Sudan,
18	and has taken demonstrable steps to—
19	"(I) end acts of genocide in the
20	Darfur region of Sudan,
21	"(II) ensure that the armed
22	forces of Sudan and any associated
23	militias are not attacking civilians or
24	obstructing human rights monitors or
25	the provision of humanitarian assist-
26	ance,

1	"(III) demobilize and disarm mi-
2	litias supported or created by the Gov-
3	ernment of Sudan,
4	"(IV) allow full and unfettered
5	access for the provision of humani-
6	tarian assistance to all regions of
7	Sudan, including Darfur, and
8	"(V) cooperate fully with the Af-
9	rican Union, the United Nations, and
10	all other observer, monitoring, and
11	protection missions mandated to oper-
12	ate in Sudan.".
