## A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Defense from purchasing certain steel or equipment, products, or systems made with steel that is not melted and poured in the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION AGAINST PURCHASING CERTAIN 4 STEEL NOT MELTED AND POURED IN THE 5 UNITED STATES. (a) Prohibition.—The Secretary of Defense may 6 not purchase—
- 8 (1) steel, or

- 1 (2) equipment, products, or systems that are
- 2 necessary to national security or national defense
- 3 and that are made with steel,
- 4 that is not melted and poured in the United States except
- 5 in cases in which the steel required for the intended use
- 6 is not melted and poured in the United States.
- 7 (b) National Security Exception.—Subsection
- 8 (a) shall not apply with respect to a purchase that the
- 9 Secretary of Defense determines is necessary for national
- 10 security purposes.
