A BILL

To prohibit the Federal Government from accepting a form of identification issued by a foreign government, except for a passport that is accepted for such a purpose on the date of enactment of this Act.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Identification Integrity
5 Act of 2003” .

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON ACCEPTANCE OF IDENTIFICATION**
2 **ISSUED BY FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—An employee of the executive, leg-
4 islative, or judicial branch of the Federal government may
5 not accept from an individual, for purposes of establishing
6 identity, a form of identification issued by a foreign gov-
7 ernment.

8 (b) EXCEPTION.—If passports issued by foreign gov-
9 ernments are authorized by Federal law to be used for
10 a specific purpose on the date of the enactment of this
11 Act, subsection (a) shall not be construed to affect such
12 authorization.
