Mr. ENGLISH introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Johanna Bell.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. WAIVER OF GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL OF, OR
4 DENIAL OF ADMISSION TO, JOHANNA BELL.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding sections
6 212(a)(6)(C)(ii) and 237(a)(3)(D) of the Immigration and
7 Nationality Act, Johanna Bell may not be removed from
8 the United States or denied admission to the United
9 States by reason of any criminal offense that is reflected
10 in the records of the Immigration and Naturalization
11 Service of the Department of Justice, the Visa Office of

1 the Department of State, or the Department of Homeland
2 Security on the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RESCISSION OF OUTSTANDING ORDER OF RE-
4 MOVAL.—The Secretary of Homeland Security or the At-
5 torney General, as appropriate, shall rescind any out-
6 standing order of removal, or any finding of inadmis-
7 sibility, that has been entered against Johanna Bell by
8 reason of any offense described in subsection (a). Any
9 such offense shall not be taken into account in deter-
10 mining whether Johanna Bell is eligible to receive a visa
11 or whether the status of Johanna Bell may be adjusted
12 to that of an alien lawfully admitted to the United States
13 for permanent residence.
