Ms. HOOLEY of Oregon (for herself and Mr. WALDEN of Oregon) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to make volunteer members of the Civil Air Patrol eligible for Public Safety Officer death benefits.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Civil Air Patrol Home-

5 land Security Benefits Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIGIBILITY OF CIVIL AIR PATROL FOR PUBLIC**2 **SAFETY OFFICER DEATH BENEFITS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1204(8) of the Omnibus

4 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C.

5 3796b(8)) is amended—

6 (1) by striking “or” at the end of subparagraph

7 (B);

8 (2) by striking the period at the end of sub-

9 paragraph (C) and inserting “; or”; and

10 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-

11 paragraph:

12 “(C) a volunteer civilian member of the

13 Civil Air Patrol who is engaged in—

14 “(i) active service, rendered in per-

15 formance or support of operational mis-

16 sions of the Civil Air Patrol under the di-

17 rective of the Department of the Air

18 Force, if such service has, and is per-

19 formed consistent with, written authoriza-

20 tion from competent authority that speci-

21 fies a finite assignment and a finite period

22 of time for such assignment; or

23 “(ii) travel to or from such service.”.

24 (b) CONSULTATION.—Section 1205 of such Act (42

25 U.S.C. 3796c) is amended by adding at the end the fol-

26 lowing new subsection:

1 “(d) In making determinations under section 1201
2 with respect to the eligibility of a volunteer civilian mem-
3 ber of the Civil Air Patrol, the Bureau may consult with
4 the Secretary of the Air Force and, if so, the Secretary
5 of the Air Force shall provide to the Bureau such assist-
6 ance and information as the Bureau considers necessary.”.
