A BILL

To recognize the birthdays of Presidents George Washington and Abraham Lincoln.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Washington-Lincoln

5 Recognition Act of 2003".

6 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY.

7 The legal public holiday known as Washington's
8 Birthday, as specified in section 6103 of title 5, United
9 States Code, shall be referred to by that name and no
10 other—

(1) by all entities and officials of the United
 States Government; and

3 (2) whenever it appears in any publication4 funded in whole or in part by Federal funds.

5 SEC. 3. PROCLAMATION ON LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY.

6 The Congress requests that the President issue a 7 proclamation each year recognizing the anniversary of the 8 birth of President Abraham Lincoln and calling upon the 9 people of the United States to observe such anniversary 10 with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
