H. R. 797

Mr. ENGLISH introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

A BILL

To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to prohibit the use of any contribution made to a candidate for election for Federal office, or any donation made to an individual as support for the individual's activities as the holder of a Federal office, for the payment of a salary to the candidate or individual or to any member of the immediate family of the candidate or individual.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Candidate Anti-Cor-
3 ruption Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITING USE OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND DONA-**
5 **TIONS FOR SALARIES OF CANDIDATES OR OF-**
6 **FICEHOLDERS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 313(b)(2) of the Federal
8 Election Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 439a(b)(2)), as
9 amended by section 301 of the Bipartisan Campaign Re-
10 form Act of 2002, is amended by striking “is used to”
11 and inserting “is used for the payment of a salary to the
12 candidate or individual involved or to any member of the
13 immediate family of the candidate or individual involved,
14 or is used to”.

15 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
16 subsection (a) shall take effect as if included in the enact-
17 ment of the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002,
18 except that the amendment shall not apply with respect
19 to any payment of a salary which is made prior to the
20 expiration of the 60-day period which begins on the date
21 of the enactment of this Act.
