A BILL

To disapprove certain sentencing guideline amendments.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fairness in Sentencing
5 Act of 2003”.

1 **SEC. 2. DISAPPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS RELATING TO**
2 **PROVIDING A MAXIMUM BASE OFFENSE**
3 **LEVEL UNDER SECTION 2D1.1(A)(3) IF THE DE-**
4 **FENDANT RECEIVES A MITIGATING ROLE AD-**
5 **JUSTMENT UNDER SECTION 3B1.2.**

6 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, section
7 2D1.1(a)(3), and the Commentary to section 3B1.2, of the
8 Sentencing Guidelines are amended to read as they read
9 without regard to the effect of Amendment 4 of the
10 “Amendments to the Sentencing Guidelines, Policy State-
11 ments, and Official Commentary” submitted by the
12 United States Sentencing Commission to Congress on May
13 1, 2002.
