A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to punish persons who use false or misleading domain names to attract children to Internet sites not appropriate for children.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Truth in Domain
- 5 Names Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. MISLEADING DOMAIN NAMES ON THE INTERNET.
- 7 (a) In General.—Chapter 110 of title 18, United
- 8 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 2252A
- 9 the following:

1 "§ 2252B. Misleading domain names on the Internet

- 2 "Whoever knowingly uses a misleading domain name
- 3 with the intent to attract a minor into viewing a visual
- 4 depiction of sexually explicit conduct on the Internet shall
- 5 be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 2
- 6 years, or both. For the purposes of this section, a domain
- 7 name that includes the word 'sex' is not misleading.".
- 8 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
- 9 at the beginning of chapter 110 of title 18, United States
- 10 Code, is amended by inserting after the time relating to
- 11 section 2252A the following new item:

"2252B. False or misleading domain names on the Internet.".
