# RESOLUTION

Requesting the President to transmit to the House of Representatives not later than 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolution documents or other materials in the President's possession relating to Iraq's weapons of mass destruction.

1       *Resolved*, That the President is requested to transmit  
2 to the House of Representatives not later than 14 days  
3 after the date of the adoption of this resolution documents  
4 or other materials in the President's possession that pro-  
5 vides specific evidence for the following claims relating to  
6 Iraq's weapons of mass destruction:

7           (1) On August 26, 2002, the Vice President in  
8 a speech stated: "Simply stated, there is no doubt  
9 that Saddam Hussein now has weapons of mass de-  
10 struction . . . What he wants is time, and more time  
11 to husband his resources to invest in his ongoing  
12 chemical and biological weapons program, and to  
13 gain possession of nuclear weapons."

14           (2) On September 12, 2002, in a speech to the  
15 United Nations General Assembly, the President  
16 stated: "Right now, Iraq is expanding and improving  
17 facilities that were used for the production of bio-  
18 logical weapons . . . Iraq has made several attempts  
19 to buy high-strength aluminum tubes used to enrich  
20 uranium for a nuclear weapon."

1           (3) On October 7, 2002, in a speech in Cin-  
2           cinnati, Ohio, the President stated: “It [Iraq] pos-  
3           sesses and produces chemical and biological weap-  
4           ons. It is seeking nuclear weapons . . . And surveil-  
5           lance photos reveal that the regime is rebuilding fa-  
6           cilities that it had used to produce chemical and bio-  
7           logical weapons.”.

8           (4) On January 7, 2003, the Secretary of De-  
9           fense at a press briefing stated: “There is no doubt  
10          in my mind but that they currently have chemical  
11          and biological weapons.”.

12          (5) On January 9, 2003, in his daily press  
13          briefing, the White House spokesperson stated: “We  
14          know for a fact that there are weapons there [in  
15          Iraq].”.

16          (6) On March 16, 2003, in an appearance on  
17          NBC’s “Meet The Press”, the Vice President stated:  
18          “We believe he [Saddam Hussein] has, in fact, re-  
19          constituted nuclear weapons. I think Mr. El Baradei  
20          frankly is wrong.”.

21          (7) On March 17, 2003, in an Address to the  
22          Nation, the President stated: “Intelligence gathered  
23          by this and other governments leaves no doubt that  
24          the Iraq regime continues to possess and conceal  
25          some of the most lethal weapons ever devised.”.

1           (8) On March 21, 2003, in his daily press brief-  
2           ing the White House spokesperson stated: “Well,  
3           there is no question that we have evidence and infor-  
4           mation that Iraq has weapons of mass destruction,  
5           biological and chemical particularly . . . all this will  
6           be made clear in the course of the operation, for  
7           whatever duration it takes.”.

8           (9) On March 24, 2003, in an appearance on  
9           CBS’s “Face the Nation”, the Secretary of Defense  
10          stated: “We have seen intelligence over many  
11          months that they have chemical and biological weap-  
12          ons, and that they have dispersed them and that  
13          they’re weaponized and that, in one case at least,  
14          the command and control arrangements have been  
15          established.”.

16          (10) On March 30, 2003, in an appearance on  
17          ABC’s “This Week”, the Secretary of Defense stat-  
18          ed: “We know where they [weapons of mass destruc-  
19          tion] are, they are in the area around Tikrit and  
20          Baghdad.”.



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
