Mrs. MYRICK, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2417) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2004 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 2417) to authorize appropriations
3 for fiscal year 2004 for intelligence and intelligence-re-
4 lated activities of the United States Government, the Com-
5 munity Management Account, and the Central Intelligence
6 Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
8 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill
9 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
10 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
11 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
12 the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. After
13 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
14 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider
15 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
16 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
17 stitute recommended by the Permanent Select Committee
18 on Intelligence now printed in the bill. The committee
19 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-
20 ered as read. All points of order against the committee
21 amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived. No
22 amendment to the committee amendment in the nature
23 of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in
24 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
25 resolution. Each amendment may be offered only in the

1 order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Mem-
2 ber designated in the report, shall be considered as read,
3 and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the
4 question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole.
5 All points of order against such amendments are waived.
6 At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amend-
7 ment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the
8 House with such amendments as may have been adopted.
9 Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House
10 on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole
11 to the bill or to the committee amendment in the nature
12 of a substitute. The previous question shall be considered
13 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
14 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
15 recommit with or without instructions.

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
