## **RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives to raise the awareness of alopecia areata.

- Whereas alopecia areata is a common autoimmune skin disease resulting in the loss of hair on the scalp and elsewhere on the body;
- Whereas alopecia areata is a common but very challenging and capricious disease affecting approximately 2 percent of the American population, amounting to more than 4.7 million people in the United States;
- Whereas, with alopecia areata, the affected hair follicles are mistakenly attacked by a person's immune system, resulting in the loss of hair;
- Whereas, although not life-threatening, alopecia areata is most certainly life-altering, and its sudden onset, recur-

rent episodes, and unpredictable course have a serious effect on a person's life and functional status at work, school, and everyday life; and

Whereas because much of the public is not familiar with alopecia areata, the reaction of the public to the disease can have a profound psychological impact on the lives of those disrupted by this disease: Now, therefore, be it
