Mr. Otter (for himself and Mr. Simpson) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

RESOLUTION

Congratulating the United States nuclear energy industry on its 50th anniversary.

- Whereas 2003 marks the 50th anniversary of President Eisenhower's "Atoms for Peace" address to the United Nations which launched a bold initiative to advance the peaceful use of nuclear energy;
- Whereas widespread use of nuclear technology in medicine, manufacturing, space exploration, research, energy production and a host of other beneficial functions has made President Eisenhower's vision a reality;
- Whereas in the early 1950's at a laboratory now known as the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory, a group of 16 scientists, engineers, and technicians produced the first usable electricity from nuclear fission, lighting four lightbulbs in a historic moment;

- Whereas in the mid 1950's the Idaho laboratory made history again when another early reactor prototype lit up the town of Arco, Idaho (population 1,000) with electricity from nuclear energy;
- Whereas today 103 nuclear power plants provide electricity to one in five homes and businesses in the United States;
- Whereas nuclear energy generates reliable, affordable electricity without emitting greenhouse gases;
- Whereas nuclear energy has contributed greatly to the general welfare of the people of the United States during the past half century; and
- Whereas nuclear energy will remain a valued energy source for many years to come, offering great promise in producing clean fuel for the future: Now, therefore, be it
