- 6 SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF SUNSET.
- 7 Section 2(f) of the Undetectable Firearms Act of
- 8 1988 (18 U.S.C. 922 note) is amended—
- 9 (1) by striking the following: "AND SUNSET
- 10 Provision.—

- 1 "(1) Effective date"; and
- 2 (2) by striking paragraph (2).
