3 **SECTION 1. ALTERNATIVE TRIGGER.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 203(c)(2) of the Tem-
5 porary Extended Unemployment Compensation Act of
6 2002 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended—

7 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking “or” at
8 the end;

3 (3) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(C) such a period would then be in effect
5 for such State under such Act if—

14 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

22 (2) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this sub-
23 section—

24 (A) the term “TEUC First Tier benefits”
25 means any benefits, other than TEUC Second

1 Tier benefits, payable to an individual under
2 the Temporary Extended Unemployment Com-
3 pensation Act of 2002; and

4 (B) the term “TEUC Second Tier bene-
5 fits” means benefits payable to an individual
6 under the Temporary Extended Unemployment
7 Compensation Act of 2002 based on a deter-
8 mination under section 203(c) thereof.
