A BILL

To amend the Help America Vote Act of 2002 to require voter verification and improved security for voting systems under title III of the Act, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting American
- 5 Democracy Act of 2003".
- 6 SEC. 2. REQUIRING VERIFICATION FOR VOTERS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 301(a)(2) of the Help
- 8 America Vote Act of 2002 (42 U.S.C. 15481(a)(2)) is

1	amended by adding at the end the following new subpara-
2	graph:
3	"(C) VOTER VERIFICATION.—
4	"(i) The voting system shall provide a
5	means by which each individual voter must
6	be able to verify his or her vote at the time
7	the vote is cast, and shall preserve each
8	vote within the polling place on the day of
9	the election in a manner that ensures the
10	security of the votes as verified for later
11	use in any audit.
12	"(ii) The voting system shall provide
13	the voter with an opportunity to correct
14	any error made by the system before the
15	permanent record is preserved for use in
16	any audit.
17	"(iii) The verified vote produced
18	under this subparagraph shall be available
19	as an official record.
20	"(iv) Any method used to permit the
21	individual voter to verify his or her vote at
22	the time the vote is cast and before a per-
23	manent record is created—
24	"(I) shall use the most accurate
25	technology, which may include voter-

1	verifiable paper ballots, votemeters,
2	modular voting architecture, and
3	encrypted votes, in a uniform and
4	nondiscriminatory manner;
5	"(II) shall guarantee voters with
6	disabilities and other affected voters
7	the ability to cast a vote in private,
8	consistent with paragraph (3)(A); and
9	"(III) shall guarantee voters al-
10	ternative language accessibility under
11	the requirements of section 203 of the
12	Voting Rights Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C.
13	1973aa–1a), consistent with para-
14	graph (4).".
15	SEC. 3. REQUIRING INCREASED SECURITY FOR VOTING
16	SYSTEMS.
17	(a) Section 301(a) of the Help America Vote Act of
18	2002 (42 U.S.C. 15481(a)) is amended by adding at the
19	end the following new paragraph:
20	"(7) Increased security for voting sys-
21	TEMS.—
22	"(A) VOTING SYSTEM SECURITY REQUIRE-
23	MENT.—The voting system shall adhere to secu-
24	rity requirements for Federal computer systems
25	or more stringent requirements adopted by the

Election Assistance Commission after receiving recommendations from the Technical Guidelines Development Committee under sections 221 and 222. Such requirements shall provide that no voting system shall contain any wireless device. All software and hardware used in any electronic voting system shall be certified by laboratories accredited by the Commission as meeting the requirements of this subsection.

"(B) Report to congress on security Review.—The Commission, in consultation with the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), shall report to Congress not later than 6 months after the date of enactment of the Protecting American Democracy Act of 2003 regarding a proposed security review and certification process for all voting systems.

"(C) GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE RE-PORT.—Not later than 3 months after the date of enactment of the Protecting American Democracy Act of 2003, the Government Accounting Office, unless the Commission has previously completed such report, shall issue a report to Congress on the operational and man-

1	agement systems that should be employed to
2	safeguard the security of voting systems, to
3	gether with a schedule for how quickly each
4	such system should be implemented.
5	"(D) Provision of Security Consulta-
6	TION SERVICES.—
7	"(i) IN GENERAL.—On and after the
8	date of enactment of the Protecting Amer-
9	ican Democracy Act of 2003, the Nationa
10	Institute of Standards and Technology
11	(NIST) shall provide security consultation
12	services to State and local jurisdictions.
13	"(ii) Authorization.—To carry our
14	the purposes of this subparagraph
15	\$2,000,0000 is authorized for each of fis-
16	cal years 2004 through 2006.".
17	SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.
18	The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
19	as if included in the enactment of the Help America Vote
