2	HONOR TO REX T. BARBER FOR VALOR DUR-

4	(a) Waiver of Time Limitations.—Notwith-
5	standing the time limitations in section 3744 of title 10,
6	United States Code, or any other time limitation applica-
7	ble with respect to the awarding of certain medals to per-
8	sons who served in the Air Force, the President is author-
9	ized and requested to award the Medal of Honor post-
10	humously under section 3741 of that title to Colonel (re-
11	tired) Rex T. Barber, United States Air Force, of
12	Terrebonne, Oregon, for the acts of valor referred to in
13	subsection (b).
14	(b) ACTION DESCRIBED.—The acts of valor referred
15	to in subsection (a) are the conspicuous acts of gallantry
16	and intrepidity of Rex T. Barber at the risk of his life
17	and above and beyond the call of duty on April 18, 1943,
18	while serving as a first lieutenant in the 339th Fighter
19	Squadron of the South Pacific Air Forces, Army Air
20	Corps, in successfully attacking and shooting down the
21	enemy bomber aircraft transporting Admiral Isoroku
22	Yamamoto, the Commander in Chief of the Combined
