- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Marriage Penalty Re-
- 5 lief Extension Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. FULL ELIMINATION OF THE MARRIAGE PENALTY
- 7 **FOR 2005.**
- 8 (a) STANDARD DEDUCTION.—Paragraph (7) of sec-
- 9 tion 63(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (relating
- 10 to applicable percentage) is amended by striking "174"
- 11 and inserting "200".

- 1 (b) 15-Percent Bracket.—Subparagraph (B) of
- 2 section 1(f)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (re-
- 3 lating to applicable percentage) is amended by striking
- 4 "180" and inserting "200".
- 5 (c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 6 this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
- 7 December 31, 2003.
- 8 (d) Application of EGTRRA Sunset to This
- 9 Section.—Each amendment made by this section shall
- 10 be subject to title IX of the Economic Growth and Tax
- 11 Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 to the same extent and
- 12 in the same manner as the provision of such Act to which
- 13 such amendment relates.
