AN ACT

To designate Fort Bayard Historic District in the State of New Mexico as a National Historic Landmark, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fort Bayard National
- 5 Historic Landmark Act".

1 SEC. 2. FORT BAYARD NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK.

- 2 (a) Designation.—The Fort Bayard Historic Dis-
- 3 trict in Grant County, New Mexico, as listed on the Na-
- 4 tional Register of Historic Places, is hereby designated as
- 5 the Fort Bayard National Historic Landmark.
- 6 (b) Administration.—
- 7 (1) Designation of the Fort Bayard Historic
- 8 District as a National Historic Landmark shall not
- 9 prohibit any actions which may otherwise be taken
- by the property owner with respect to the property.
- 11 (2) Nothing in this Act shall affect the adminis-
- tration of the Fort Bayard Historic District by the
- 13 State of New Mexico.

14 SEC. 3. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.

- 15 (a) In General.—The Secretary, in consultation
- 16 with the State of New Mexico, may enter into cooperative
- 17 agreements with appropriate public or private entities, for
- 18 the purposes of protecting historic resources at Fort Bay-
- 19 and and providing educational and interpretive facilities
- 20 and programs for the public. The Secretary shall not enter
- 21 into any agreement or provide assistance to any activity
- 22 affecting Fort Bayard State Hospital without the concur-
- 23 rence of the State of New Mexico.
- (b) Technical and Financial Assistance.—The
- 25 Secretary may provide technical and financial assistance

- 1 with any entity with which the Secretary has entered into
- 2 a cooperative agreement under subsection (a).
- 3 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 4 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 5 as may be necessary to carry out this Act.
