A BILL

To establish the Weather Modification Operations and Research Board and outline its duties and responsibilities.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Weather Modification
- 5 Research and Technology Transfer Authorization Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.
- 7 It is the purpose of this Act to develop and implement
- 8 a comprehensive and coordinated national weather modi-
- 9 fication policy and a national cooperative Federal and

- 1 State program of weather modification research and devel-
- 2 opment.

- 3 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
- 4 In this Act:
- (1) BOARD.—The term "board" means the
 Weather Modification Advisory and Research Board.
 - (2) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.—The term "executive director" means the executive director of the Weather Modification Advisory and Research Board.
 - (3) Research and development" means theoretical analysis, explorations, experimentation, and the extension of investigative findings and theories of scientific or technical nature into practical application for experimental and demonstration purposes, including the experimental production and testing of models, devices, equipment, materials, and processes.
 - (4) WEATHER MODIFICATION.—The term "weather modification" means changing or controlling, or attempting to change or control, by artificial methods the natural development of atmospheric cloud forms or precipitation forms which occur in the troposphere.

1	SEC. 4. WEATHER MODIFICATION ADVISORY AND RE-
2	SEARCH BOARD ESTABLISHED.
3	(a) In General.—There is established in the De-
4	partment of Commerce the Weather Modification Advisory
5	and Research Board.
6	(b) Membership.—
7	(1) In general.—The board shall consist of
8	11 members appointed by the Secretary of Com-
9	merce, of whom—
10	(A) at least 1 shall be a representative of
11	the American Meteorological Society;
12	(B) at least 1 shall be a representative of
13	the American Society of Civil Engineers;
14	(C) at least 1 shall be a representative of
15	the National Academy of Sciences;
16	(D) at least 1 shall be a representative of
17	the National Center for Atmospheric Research
18	of the National Science Foundation;
19	(E) at least 2 shall be representatives of
20	the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Admin-
21	istration of the Department of Commerce;
22	(F) at least 1 shall be a representative of
23	institutions of higher education or research in-
24	stitutes; and

1	(G) at least 1 shall be a representative of
2	a State that is currently supporting operational
3	weather modification projects.
4	(2) Service as members.—A member of the
5	board shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary of
6	Commerce.
7	(3) Vacancies.—Any vacancy on the board
8	shall be filled in the same manner as the original ap-
9	pointment.
10	(b) Advisory Committees.—The board may estab-
11	lish advisory committees to advise the board and to make
12	recommendations to the board concerning legislation, poli-
13	cies, administration, research, and other matters.
14	(c) Initial Meeting.—Not later than 30 days after
15	the date on which all members of the board have been
16	appointed, the board shall hold its first meeting.
17	(d) MEETINGS.—The board shall meet at the call of
18	the Chair.
19	(e) Quorum.—A majority of the members of the
20	board shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number of
21	members may hold hearings.
22	(f) CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR.—The board shall select

 $23\,\,$ a Chair and Vice Chair from among its members.

1 SEC. 5. DUTIES OF THE BOARD.

2	(a) Promotion of Research and Develop-
3	MENT.—In order to assist in expanding the theoretical
4	and practical knowledge of weather modification, the
5	board shall promote and fund research and development,
6	studies, and investigations with respect to—
7	(1) improved forecast and decision-making tech-
8	nologies for weather modification operations, includ-
9	ing tailored computer workstations and software and
10	new observation systems with remote sensors; and
11	(2) assessments and evaluations of the efficacy
12	of weather modification, both purposeful (including
13	cloud-seeding operations) and inadvertent (including
14	downwind effects and anthropogenic effects).
15	(b) FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.—Unless the use of the
16	money is restricted or subject to any limitations provided
17	by law, the board shall use amounts in the Weather Modi-
18	fication Research and Development Fund—
19	(1) to pay its expenses in the administration of
20	this Act, and
21	(2) to provide for research and development
22	with respect to weather modifications by grants to,
23	or contracts or cooperative arrangements, with pub-
24	lic or private agencies

- 1 (c) Report.—The board shall provide the Secretary
- 2 with a report of its findings and research results bienni-
- 3 ally.

4 SEC. 6. POWERS OF THE BOARD.

- 5 (a) Studies, Investigations and Hearings.—
- 6 The board may make any studies or investigations, obtain
- 7 any information, and hold any hearings necessary or prop-
- 8 er to administer or enforce this Act or any rules or orders
- 9 issued under this Act.
- 10 (b) Personnel.—The board may hire an executive
- 11 director and other support staff, as provided by the appro-
- 12 priations act, necessary to perform duties and functions
- 13 under this Act.
- (c) Cooperation With Other Agencies.—The
- 15 board may cooperate with public or private agencies to
- 16 promote the purposes of this Act.
- 17 (d) Cooperative Agreements.—The board may
- 18 enter into cooperative agreements with the agencies of the
- 19 United States, States of the United States and their coun-
- 20 ties and cities, or with any private or public agencies or
- 21 organizations for conducting weather modification activi-
- 22 ties or cloud-seeding operations.
- 23 (e) Conduct and Contracts for Research and
- 24 Development.—The executive director, with approval of
- 25 the board, may conduct and may contract for research and

- 1 development activities relating to the purposes of this sec-
- 2 tion.

3 SEC. 7. COOPERATION WITH THE WEATHER MODIFICATION

- 4 OPERATIONS AND RESEARCH BOARD.
- 5 Agencies of the United States and other public or pri-
- 6 vate agencies and institutions that receive research funds
- 7 from the United States are directed to the extent possible
- 8 to give full support and cooperation to the board and to
- 9 initiate independent research and development programs
- 10 that address weather modifications.

11 SEC. 8. FUNDING.

- 12 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is established within the
- 13 Treasury of the United States the Weather Modification
- 14 Research and Development Fund, which shall consist of
- 15 amounts appropriated pursuant to subsection (b) or re-
- 16 ceived by the board under subsection (c).
- 17 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 18 authorized to be appropriated to the board for the pur-
- 19 poses of carrying out the provisions of this Act
- 20 \$10,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2004 through 2013.
- 21 Any sums appropriated under this subsection shall remain
- 22 available, without fiscal year limitation, until expended.
- 23 (c) Gifts.—The board may accept, use, and dispose
- 24 of gifts or donations of services or property.

1 SEC. 9. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 2 The provisions of this Act shall apply on and after
- 3 October 1, 2003.
