# A BILL

To establish a first responder and terrorism preparedness grant information hotline, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "First Responders
- 5 Homeland Defense Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 In this Act:
- 8 (1) Local Government.—The term "local
- 9 government" has the meaning given that term under

- 1 section 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
- 2 U.S.C. 101(10)).
- 3 (2) Non-profit organization.—The term
- 4 "non-profit organization" means an organization de-
- 5 scribed under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Rev-
- 6 enue Code of 1986 and exempt from taxation under
- 7 section 501(a) of such Code.
- 8 (3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
- 9 the Secretary of Homeland Security.

#### 10 SEC. 3. GRANT INFORMATION HOTLINE.

- 11 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall establish a
- 12 toll-free hotline through which local governments and non-
- 13 profit organizations may obtain information regarding all
- 14 Federal grant programs that make funds available for the
- 15 assistance of first responders and for terrorism prepared-
- 16 ness.
- 17 (b) Information.—The information available
- 18 through the hotline established under subsection (a) shall
- 19 include the types of grants available, application proce-
- 20 dures, and such other information as the Secretary deter-
- 21 mines necessary.
- 22 (c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 23 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
- 24 essary to carry out this section.

### 1 SEC. 4. FIRST RESPONDER GRANT PROGRAM.

- 2 (a) In General.—The Secretary is authorized to
- 3 make grants, on a competitive basis, to non-profit organi-
- 4 zations eligible under subsection (c), for the purpose of
- 5 training and equipping first responders.
- 6 (b) APPLICATION.—A non-profit organization may
- 7 apply for a grant under subsection (a) by submitting an
- 8 application to the Secretary, in such form and containing
- 9 such information as prescribed by the Secretary.
- 10 (c) Eligible Non-Profit Organizations.—Non-
- 11 profit organizations that operate training programs for
- 12 first responders in conjunction with a local agency shall
- 13 be eligible to receive a grant under subsection (a).
- 14 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 15 are authorized to be appropriated \$50,000,000 in each of
- 16 fiscal years 2005 through 2009, to carry out this section.
- 17 SEC. 5. COMMUNICATION SYSTEM GRANTS.
- 18 (a) In General.—The Secretary is authorized to
- 19 make grants, on a competitive basis, to States, local gov-
- 20 ernments, local law enforcement agencies, and local fire
- 21 departments to assist in—
- 22 (1) improving communication systems to allow
- for real-time, interoperable communication between
- 24 State and local first responders; or

1	(2) the purchase of communication systems that
2	allow for real-time, interoperable communication be-
3	tween such State and local first responders.

- 4 (b) Application.—Any State, local government,
- 5 local law enforcement agency, or local fire department that
- 6 desires to receive a grant under subsection (a) shall sub-
- 7 mit an application to the Secretary, in such form and con-
- 8 taining such information as prescribed by the Secretary.
- 9 (c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 10 are authorized to be appropriated \$300,000,000 in each
- 11 of fiscal years 2005 through 2009, to carry out this sec-

12 tion.
