## A BILL

To adjust the boundary of the John Muir National Historic Site, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “John Muir National  
5 Historic Site Boundary Adjustment Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 (a) HISTORIC SITE.—The term “Historic Site”  
8 means the John Muir National Historic Site established  
9 by the Act of August 31, 1964 (78 Stat. 753; 16 U.S.C.  
10 461 note).

1 (b) MAP.—The term “map” means the map entitled  
2 “Boundary Map, John Muir National Historic Site”,  
3 numbered PWR–OL 426–80,044a, and dated August  
4 2001.

5 (c) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means the  
6 Secretary of the Interior.

7 **SEC. 3. BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT.**

8 (a) ACQUISITION OF LAND.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may acquire  
10 the land or any interests in the land depicted as the  
11 “Boundary Adjustment Area” on the map for addi-  
12 tion to the Historic Site.

13 (2) MEANS.—An acquisition of land or interest  
14 in land under paragraph (1) may be made by dona-  
15 tion, purchase from a willing seller with donated or  
16 appropriated funds, or exchange.

17 (b) ADJUSTMENT.—The boundary of the Historic  
18 Site shall be adjusted to reflect the acquisition of land  
19 under subsection (a).

20 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary shall admin-  
21 ister any land or interests in land acquired under sub-  
22 section (b) as part of the Historic Site in accordance with  
23 any laws applicable to the Historic Site.
