A BILL

To provide for certain financial reporting requirements to apply to the judicial branch of the Federal Government, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Judicial Branch Fi-
- 5 nancial Accountability Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. FEDERAL JUDICIARY.
- 7 (a) In General.—The Federal Judiciary shall annu-
- 8 ally have independently audited financial statements pre-
- 9 pared for fiscal year 2005, and each fiscal year thereafter,

1	covering all the accounts and associated activities of the
2	judicial branch.
3	(b) Separate Statements.—The Judicial Con-
4	ference of the United States shall determine whether to
5	have separate financial statements for the—
6	(1) Supreme Court of the United States;
7	(2) United States Court of Appeals for the Fed-
8	eral Circuit;
9	(3) United States Court of International Trade;
10	(4) Administrative Office of the United States
11	Courts;
12	(5) Federal Judicial Center;
13	(6) Judicial retirement funds;
14	(7) United States Sentencing Commission; or
15	(8) other courts or services paid from the ap-
16	propriations for "Courts of Appeals, District Courts,
17	and Other Judicial Services".
18	SEC. 3. PREPARATION AND AUDIT OF STATEMENTS.
19	(a) Preparation.—The Administrative Office of the
20	United States Courts shall prepare the financial state-
21	ments required by this Act in accordance with United
22	States generally accepted accounting principles.
23	(b) Audit.—
24	(1) In general.—The Judicial Conference of
25	the United States shall provide, by contract, for an

1	independent auditor to audit the financial state
2	ments required by this Act in accordance with gen
3	erally accepted government auditing standards.
4	(2) Report.—Not later than 45 days after the
5	end of the defined fiscal year, whether calendar or
6	fiscal, and each year thereafter, the Administrative
7	Office of the United States Courts shall complete
8	and submit an independently audited financial state
9	ment that shall be—
10	(A) available to the public; and
11	(B) submitted to—
12	(i) the Committee on the Judiciary of
13	the Senate and the Committee on Govern
14	mental Affairs of the Senate; and
15	(ii) the Committee on the Judiciary of
16	the House of Representatives and the
17	Committee on Government Reform of the
18	House of Representatives.
19	SEC. 4. REPORT.
20	(a) In General.—Not later than 90 days after the
21	date of enactment of this Act, a report described under
22	subsection (b) shall be submitted by the Judicial Con

23 ference to—

1	(1) the Committee on the Judiciary of the Sen-
2	ate and the Committee on Governmental Affairs of
3	the Senate; and
4	(2) the Committee on the Judiciary of the
5	House of Representatives and the Committee on
6	Government Reform of the House of Representa-
7	tives.
8	(b) Content.—The report under subsection (a) shall
9	include—
10	(1) a plan for implementation of this Act; and
11	(2) recommendations, including legislative ac-
12	tions and amendments to this Act, if necessary, to
13	effectively carry out this Act.
14	SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
15	There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
16	as may be necessary to carry out this Act in fiscal year
17	2005 and each fiscal year thereafter
