## A BILL

To provide for certain financial reporting requirements to apply to the legislative branch of the Federal Government, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Legislative Branch Fi-
- 5 nancial Accountability Act of 2004".
- 6 SEC. 2. CONGRESS.
- 7 (a) In General.—The Senate and the House of
- 8 Representatives each shall annually have a financial state-
- 9 ment prepared in accordance with United States generally
- 10 accepted accounting principles, and have the statement

- 1 independently audited, for the preceding calendar year
- 2 covering all the accounts and associated activities of the
- 3 Senate and the House of Representatives, respectively.
- 4 (b) Financial Statement.—Each financial state-
- 5 ment shall reflect the organizational structure of the Sen-
- 6 ate and House of Representatives, respectively, and shall
- 7 cover accounts and financial information for all entities
- 8 of the Senate and House of Representatives, respectively.
- 9 Joint activities shall be reflected in the financial statement
- 10 of a House of Congress to the extent that the House funds
- 11 the activities.
- 12 SEC. 3. AGENCIES.
- (a) In General.—Each agency under subsection (b)
- 14 shall annually have a financial statement prepared in ac-
- 15 cordance with United States generally accepted accounting
- 16 principles, and have the statement independently audited,
- 17 for the preceding fiscal year covering all the accounts and
- 18 associated activities of the agency.
- 19 (b) The agencies referred to under subsection (a) are
- 20 the—
- 21 (1) Library of Congress;
- 22 (2) Congressional Budget Office;
- 23 (3) Government Accountability Office;
- 24 (4) Government Printing Office;
- 25 (5) United States Botanic Garden;

3	(8) any other entity of the legislative branch es-
4	tablished by Congress and not required by statute to
5	have annual financial statements independently au-

7	SEC. 4. REPORT.
8	(a) In General.—Not later than 90 days after the
9	date of enactment of this Act, a report described under
10	subsection (b)—
11	(1) shall be submitted by the Committee on
12	Rules and Administration of the Senate, with re-
13	spect to the entities of the Senate, to the Committee
14	on Governmental Affairs of the Senate;
15	(2) shall be submitted by the Committee on Ad-
16	ministration of the House of Representatives, with
17	respect to entities of the House of Representatives,
18	to the Committee on Government Reform of the
19	House of Representatives; and
20	(3) shall be submitted by each legislative agency
21	or entity under section 3 to the—
22	(A) Committee on Rules and Administra-
23	tion of the Senate and the Committee on Gov-
24	ernmental Affairs of the Senate; and

2	House of Representatives and the Committee
3	on Government Reform of the House of Rep-

5	(b) Content.—Each report under subsection (a)

12	effectively carry out this Act.

- 1 (2) Legislative agencies and entities.— 2 Not later than 60 days after the submission of the 3 report under section 5, the head of each legislative 4 agency or entity shall designate an individual or es-5 tablish an office that shall prepare the financial 6 statements required by this Act in accordance with 7 United States generally accepted accounting prin-8 ciples.
- 9 (b) AUDIT.—With respect to the financial statements 10 of each House of Congress and each legislative agency or other entity, the majority leader of the Senate in consulta-12 tion with the minority leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives in consultation with the minority leader of the House of Representatives, and the 14 15 head of each legislative agency or other entity, respectively, shall provide, by contract, for an independent audit 16 17 of the financial statements required by this Act in accord-18 ance with generally accepted government auditing stand-19 ards. Not later than 45 days after the end of the applica-20 ble fiscal year, whether calendar or fiscal, and each year 21 thereafter, each House of Congress and head of legislative 22 agency or entity shall complete and make available to the public the independently audited financial statement.

### 1 SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 2 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 3 as may be necessary to carry out this Act in fiscal year
- 4 2005, and each fiscal year thereafter.

### 5 SEC. 7. EFFECTIVE DATES.

- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Sections 2 and 3 shall take effect
- 7 in the applicable fiscal year, whether calendar or fiscal,
- 8 during which the office referred to in section 5 is estab-
- 9 lished.
- 10 (b) Administrative Provisions.—Sections 1, 4, 5,
- 11 and 6 shall take effect on the date of enactment of this
- 12 Act.
